tarded, held Saturday in Milton. She noted the Milton-Halton Hills group was one of the first of 18 such associations founded in Ontario and thus had been a guiding light for the rest of the

She said the Ontario Association is currently heavily involved with a number of bills and legislation

which have direct effects of the trainable retarded and the retarded and their role within society.

Mrs. Ellingham said the association is leading the fight to include the retarded in Bill 70, which involves occupational safety in workshops. She said the retarded are not covered by the bill at present, but ex-
