A day there and you're all set for the breathtaking splendour of Niagara Falls lit to new beauty at night. Your hotel is almost beside the Falls. Sightsee the Canadian Horseshoe Falls; the American Falls; the Royal Tower; Upper Falls View Area; Dufferin Islands; Table Rock; Whirlpool Rapids; Spanish Aerocar; and the Hydro Floral Clock. Free time to experience the Falls from underneath in "Maid of the Mist". Or above in the Spanish Aerocar. Back to Toronto where the Cavalier whisks you to Montreal and the end of your tour.

### QUÉBEC DISCOVERER

It doesn't matter when you decide to take this trip. It's seven days of fantastic fun whenever. Take any VIA train from Toronto to Ottawa... the graceful national capital, laced with canals and parks and beautiful buildings. Take the 2-hour sightseeing tour around the Rideau Canal and locks; the National Arts Centre; the Parliament Buildings with their magnificent Peace Tower; and the modern Mall where you can shop amidst trees, fountains and flowers. On to Montreal in a comfortable VIA train where you have two nights of fine French living. Sightsee Montreal's Notre Dame Church; St. Joseph's Oratory; and Old Montreal.
