First a train from Toronto or Southwestern Ontario, Overnight to Montreal. Shop, Sightsee. Then the train to Chicoutimi and a 317-mile run through the rural beauty of Quebec. Three nights in Chicoutimi and a cruise on the Saguenay River. Your rental car lets you explore the Lac St. Jean area. Go to a ghost town at Val Jalbert; the zoological gardens at St. Felicien; and the Indian Village at Pointe Bleue. Drive the Murray Bay countryside. You stay two nights in a local hotel. Tour around Murray Bay. Continue at leisure to Quebec City, There's an

artists colony at Baie St. Paul; a wildlife refuge at Cap Tourmente; the famous healing shrine of Ste.
Anne-de-Beaupre; the cable car to the top of Mont Ste. Anne; olde worlde He d'Orleans and the Montmorency Falls. In Quebec City a sight-seeing tour shows you the full charm of this walled city. Before you board the Rapido for Montreal (Toronto passengers continue on the overnight Cavalier) you have time for a pleasant ferry ride across the St. Lawrence to Levis. And a walk around Place Royale.
