And a car for driving along the Cabot Trail; to the Fortress at Louisbourg; and Glace Bay. Stay at Baddeck. Then VIA back to Moncton through the Wentworth Valley and Tantramar Marshes. Spend a night in Moncton. And car around the beaches and farms of Prince Edward Island. Maybe cruise across the Northumberland Strait before leaving from Moncton on the Ocean for an over-

night trip to Montreal and Toronto.
