Wood given conditional discharge

A former Acton OPP officer and Georgetown resident who pleaded guilty to theft charges recently has been given a conditional discharge.

Roy Wood, 42, a former Peel Regional Police detective, was charged last summer with the theft of about \$1,000 of merchandise which was being stored in the property room of a Mississauga police station. He pleaded guilty to the charge and was convicted.

County Court Judge Frank Dunlap handed down the conditional discharge last Wednesday. Wood must undergo psychiatric counselling as part of his one year period of probation.

At his trial psychiatric evidence was introduced which lead the judge to conclude Wood was trapped in a male menopause or mid-life crises.

"I make no brief for police officers, but I interpret what went on in

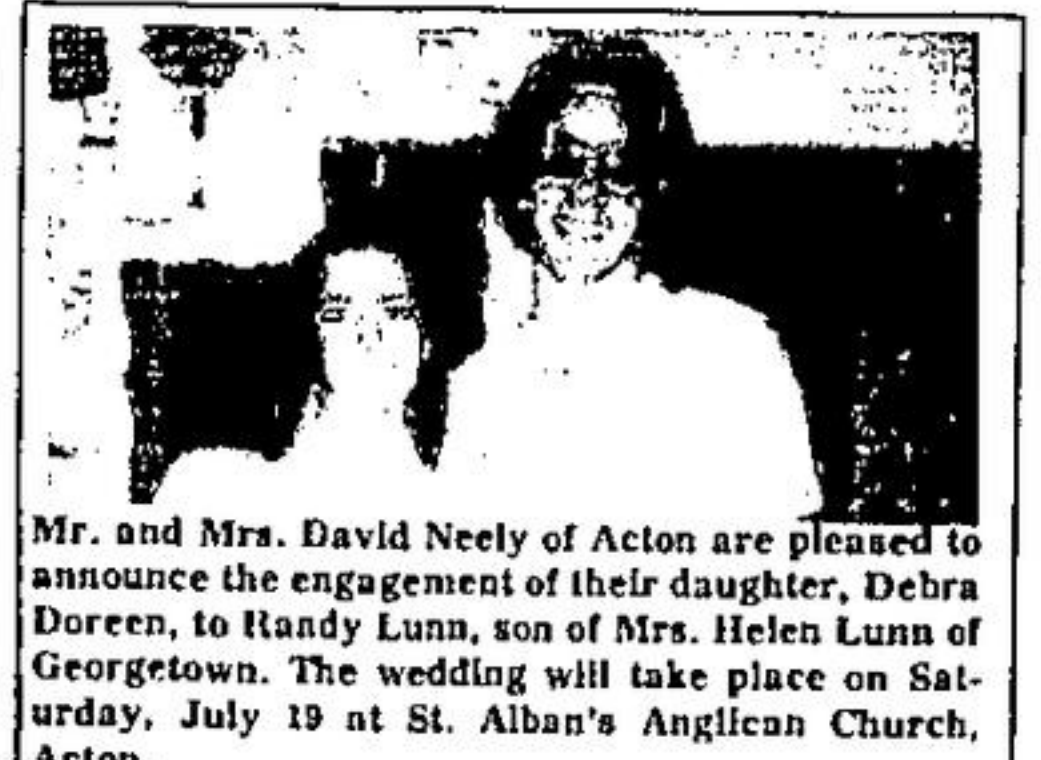
July, 1979, as a cry for help from a man plagued by influences which destroyed his judgement," Judge Dunlap said.

Wood was described in court as a broken man, separated from his wife, in conflict with his 20-year-old daughter Kim, he suffered two heart attacks during the past decade, was distressed by his sister's battle with leukemia and was badly injured in a serious car accident.

Dunlap, in reviewing the psychiatric evidence, observed Wood was so ridden with guilt and anxiety he did something illegal so he would be caught and punished.

Wood was vacationing in England when the theft was discovered and the goods recovered during a raid of his Georgetown home. He returned to

Canada voluntarily only after extradition proceedings were started. The stolen goods included a color television, camera, clothing and household items and had been seized by police in a raid of a suspected shoplifter's home. Wood was described as a model police officer before the theft.
