School trip to continue despite stolen funds

Despite stolen funds, 78 grade 8 students from Mackenzie-Smith Middle School will be going to Washington on May 28, says principal John Simpson.

A thief, still unknown, made off with a portion of student money designated for the trip from a teachers locked locker sometime between 9:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. May 2. Mr. Simpson refused to reveal the exact amount of money saying it's in the hands of the Halton Regional Police, but he commented it was "in excess of \$100".

It appears, Mr. Simpson said, someone may have entered the school through the public portion of the school kept open for access to the swimming pool. However, he remarks, evidence indicates the thief knew the combination of the lock and the exact whereabouts of the money. The combination lock was opened and a locked teacher's room

through which the thief travelled revealed evidence of someone working away at the locks, says Mr. Simpson. There are only two places in the school where the combination can be found according to the principal.

The money will be replaced by the Halton School Board and the teacher who was responsible for the money, in a 50-50 split.

"Unfortunately, the onus is on the teacher

who had the money in trust", Mr. Simpson says.

The four day trip will cost each student \$125. Youngsters raised their own money and had the help of a donation from the Acton Skate-a-thon.

"It's put a damper on the trip," Mr. Simpson agrees, "we've talked to the students asking for clues and information. It's a serious question of trust factor... we have to rethink what to expect in Washington. But we wouldn't have cancelled the trip."

Halton police are still investigating the matter with no further developments.

Police consider cruisers

Halton Regional Police would like to move to smaller, more fuel efficient cruisers but these cars are presenting some problems.

Halton Police Commissioners were told the smaller cars will mean officers will have to learn how to drive again, as the cars are lighter in weight but have large engines.

One civilian member of the force has tried the small car-large engine combination and he found it a very powerful handful.

The other problem is that the extras police need, like limited slip differentials, heavy duty suspensions, and stabilizer bars are not often available on the new generation of smaller cars.

While these options are in many cases standard on large cars, Police Chief Jim Harding said he believes the force should move to mid-size autos.

Police are now tendering for replacement cruisers and commissioners decided to leave the size open so that police could get quotes on all types of cars.
