**Wage terms on the way**

A contract award for Halton's 1,165 secondary teachers is expected to be announced today (Wednesday).

Halton Board of Education officials and members of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation District 9 met mediator-arbitrator Martin Teplitsky for three days in Toronto on the weekend.

The meetings bring an end to the mediation process which teachers voted to accept earlier this year.

Neither the board or teachers will vote on acceptance of the two-year

package. Both sides in the nine-month long contract dispute accepted the mediation and arbitration process.

Under mediation Teplitsky could have attempted to persuade the sides to accept some points with respect to wages, working conditions and other outstanding matters. Then under arbitration he could tell them what they are getting.

Halton school trustees, prior to the decision on the award, voted a substantial advance in salary based on the probable settlement to teachers.

**Existing signs stay despite new by-law**

Signs already up at Acton and Esqueping shops will remain despite the fact Halton Hills will likely soon have a new sign by-law.

Monday night Halton Hills general committee, while debating the substance of the new by-law
