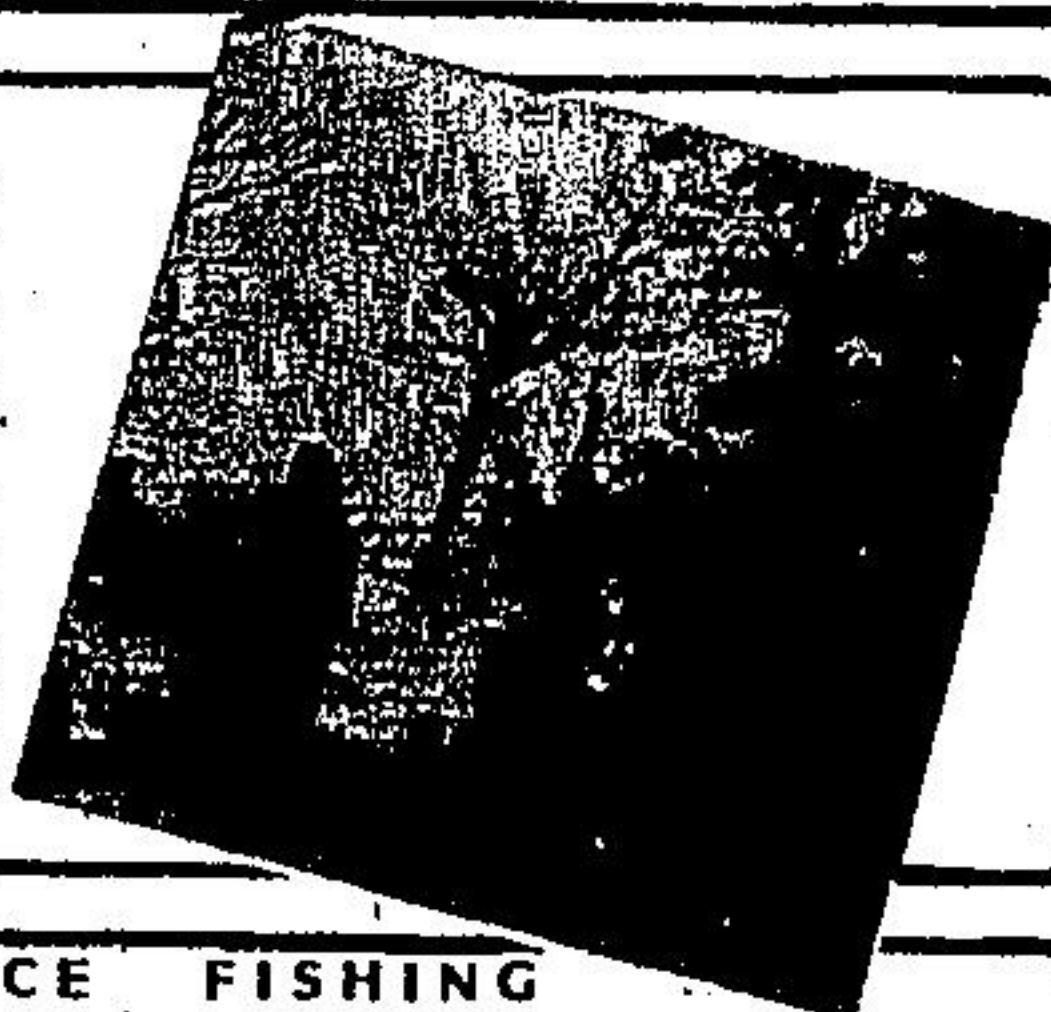
SKIING
