Downtown Timmins

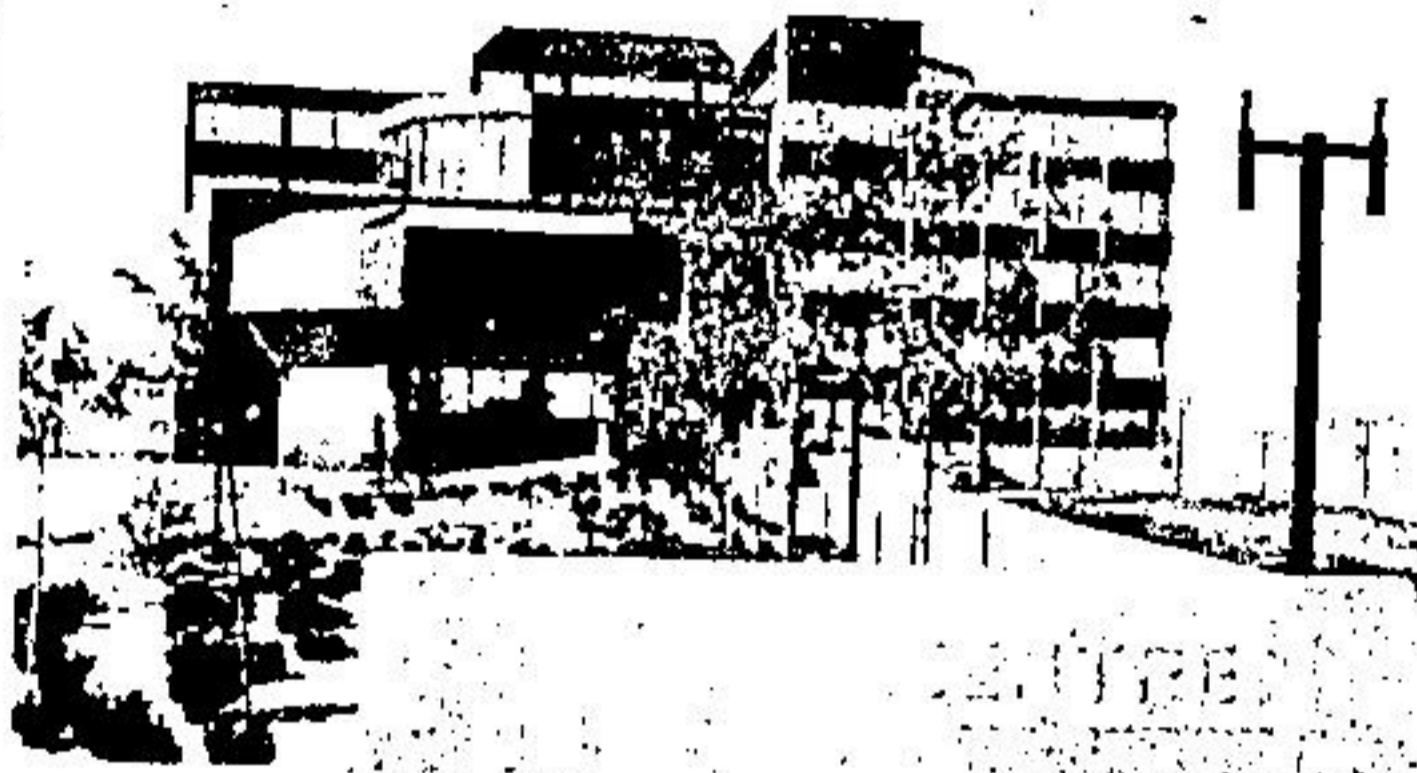
The city of Timmins is spread over 1,260 square miles, which makes it the largest city in area, in all of Canada.
