

Halton Chamber revived

The reactivated Halton Chambers of Commerce Association should provide the region's industrial and commercial sector with a stronger voice on matters of regional concern.

That's the opinion of Oakville Chamber of Commerce president John Wiskin, a major force in reactivating the association which has been in a state of limbo since 1978.

"It's one thing for the individual chambers to have input into regional matters, but you often run into selfish local attitudes," said Wiskin, who stepped down as Oakville chamber president on July 1.

"This regional association will have to look at things from a regional view."

According to Mr. Wiskin, the association was formed shortly after regional government was introduced, but disbanded about two years ago.

However, with the proposed Draft Economic Strategy report produced by the region's economic development officer Bill Marshall, earlier this year Mr. Wiskin said he felt it was time to get the association back on its feet to provide input on regional issues.

As well as discussing the economic strategy, the association with representatives from Oakville, Burlington, Milton, Georgetown and Acton, has formed a committee to promote tourism throughout the region.

Mr. Wiskin said one of the first priorities of the tourism committee will be to produce a brochure outlining community events throughout the region.

"The idea actually came when Festival Country approached the region about starting a festival region-wide," Mr. Wiskin explained.

"But, rather than trying to create a new Halton festival, we thought it would be worthwhile to co-ordinate all the events already in the region. It would be crazy to drop something that is good, like the Steam-Era in Milton, in favor of something that's never been tried," he said.

Mr. Wiskin suggested the brochure could go to provincial tourist bureaus to promote tourism in Halton.

He said the committee will meet early in July and hopes to have a small brochure ready for the fall months.

Many of the lovely trees on the grounds of Robert Little School were planted back in the 1860s and 70s when the man after whom the school is named was principal of Acton Public School.



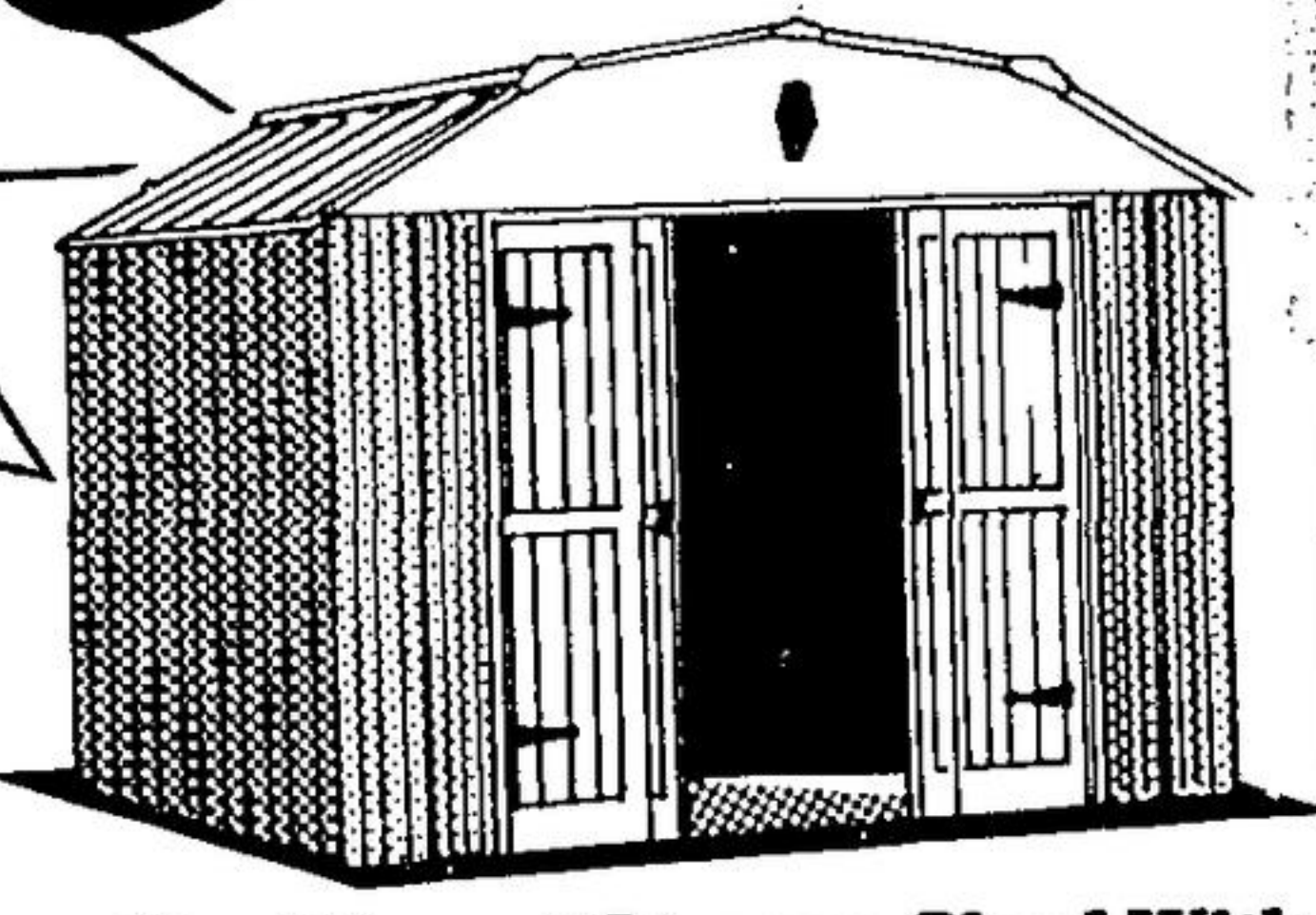

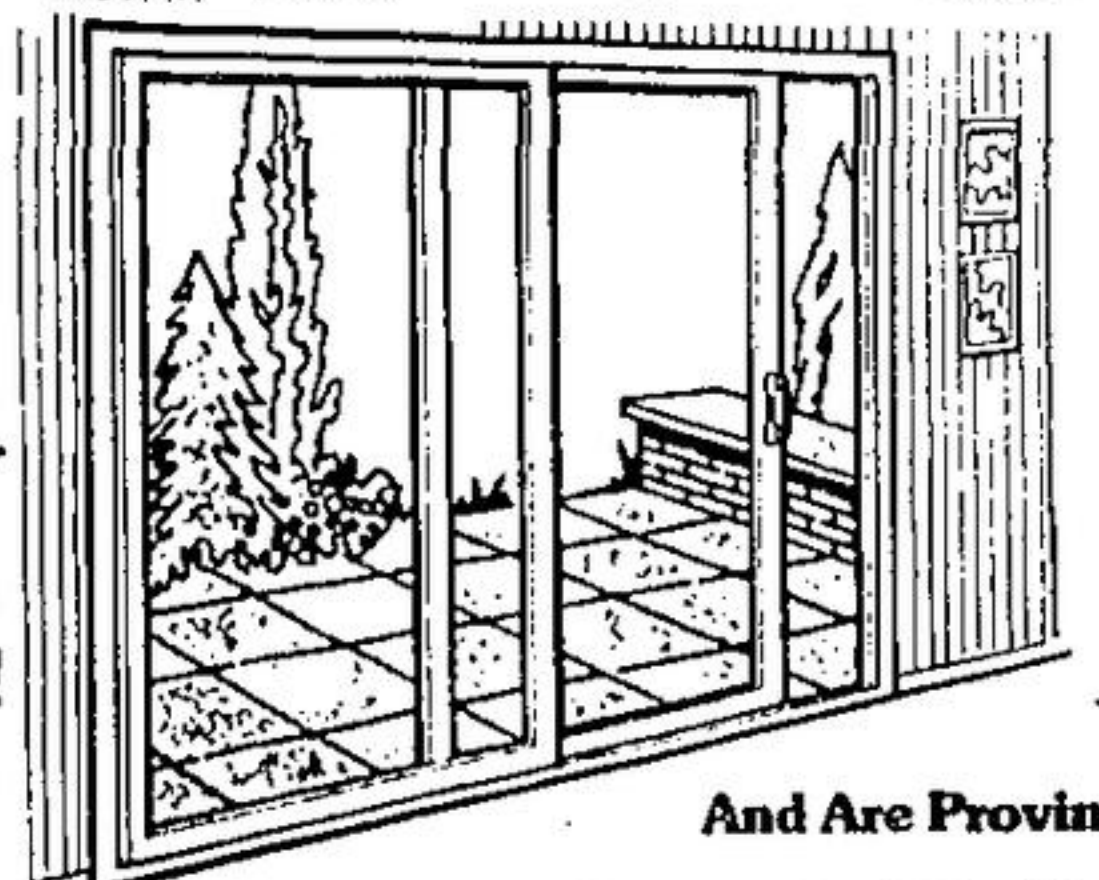
