The motion was made by Burlington Mayor Roly Bird at last

He said he was "sick of all the posturing" and the only thing was to go directly to Queen's Park. This motion must be debated at a full council meeting before it

can proceed further. Regional Chairman Jack Raftis said he would "lead the delegation" myself to Queen's Park after he was told by Milton Mayor Don Gordon the two previous regional chairman had refused to take the question of continuing Halton Regionalism to the Cabinet.


