## 'He's determined' -volunteer

By Wilma Blokhuls "Terry is very shy, casy to talk to, and very determined," sald Joan Gibb, public relations volunteer with the Oakville unit of the Canadian Cancer Society, in a tele-

phone interview Monday.

His early evening arrival at Sheridan College culminated at least two months of preparations and fund raising, and all of it seemed so fruitless and frustrating Sunday, until she heard that Terry Fox would make an appear-ance at Sheridan College before having dinner and calling it the day at the Hollday Inn. His arrival, by van, was two hours behind his scheduled 4 p.m. appearance, but, Joan convinced a crowd

of at least 200 to await their hero. Joan waved a largeformat cheque to keep herself cool, as she stood beside Terry, smiling non-stop. "Last Tuesday (July 8) I had \$245, so I had this big cheque made up. I changed that to \$8,600 when Darrel came (initially on behalf of his

brother) at 4 p.m. "And when Terry came himself, the total was Within \$11,239!" two hours, another \$3,000 was donated by the crowd.

"I began the day with \$6,000," said Joan, "and we raised another \$5,000 on Sunday." Hence, Terry : received about "and there's \$12,000.

more money coming in!" In appreciation for all her efforts, Joan had dinner with Terry and those who accompanied him, and learned more about this courageous one-leg-

ged runner. "He is very determined to meet his goal," Joan sald, "and he's going to achieve it."

Terry began his trek across Canada, from St. John's, Nfld., to Vancouver, B.C., on April 12. "He was scheduled to be here by June 14," Joan said, adding he has fallen behind one-month schedule because of numerous side-trips, fatigue, ice and snow, and the wind throwing him off

balance. Yet, in Oakville, he appeared "quite normal, not obsessed with being tired," Joan said, "We about normal talked things, sports-hockey and football, the things

## Hero welcomed in Halton

BY KELLY FRANK Opening cermonies for a makeshift reception for Terry Fox were conducted by his brother Darrell at

Sheridan College, Sunday. Terry, who's jogging across Canada to raise money for cancer research, was late for the reception. The one legged jogger got behind schedule after being

held up on his trek through Mississauga. Darrell was nervous but managed a well rehearsed speech about brother before turning the microphone over to Doug Alward who's been driving the van for

Terry since they started out from Newfoundland. Speaking on Terry's behalf Doug related the hardships Terry's endured since losing his right leg to cancer and his purpose in running the Marathon of

He said after Terry had his leg amputated he had to go through a year and a half of chemotherapy treatment "to kill all the cancer cells."

"The drugs used on Terry gave him a fifty per cent chance of living," said Doug. "Two years earlier the drugs hadn't even been developed and Terry would've only had a 15 per cent chance of living.

This led to Doug's next point, that money is desperately needed to combat other forms of cancer for which no treatment has yet been developed. And that's what Terry's jogging for-hope for cancer stricken patients everywhere.

"The chances of you getting cancer some time in your life is about 25 per cent since one in four people eventually get it."

## Library 100seleaf

by Eather Taylor According to the Oxford English dictionary a Paladin is: one of the 12 peers or famous warriors of Charlemagne's court, of whom the Count Palatine was the foremost: also, fig. a knightly hero, renowned champion, knight errant. Recruited as a schoolboy by Winston Churchill, Christopher Creighton (a fictitious name) became the British war leader's Paladin under the code name Christopher Robin. His extraordinary adventures as Churchill's personal warrior are chronicled as a novel by American

writer, Brian Garfield, who has been writing fulltime since 1963. In his foreword to The Paladin, Garfield notes that the hero of his narrative is a real person now In his lifties. "He is a remarkable man." The boy who became a remarkable man was 15, when he first encountered Churchill. The encounter was more of a crash confrontation, after Christopher in search of adventure tried to scale a wall of fresh red bricks. The bricks gave way, and Christopher tumbled, rubble falling around him. He heard a bellow and a clatter, both noises emanating from a large, fat furious man beside a barrow full of wet mortar. Thus, Christopher Robin met the man who was his parents' landlord, Britain's war prime minister, who recrulted the boy that same year to make his first

try at espionage while a guest of his Belgian schoolPrince Paul. Christopher's first harrowing assignment on Belgian soll began an incredible wartime career under the leadership of Churchill (code name: Tigger) which include assassination, murder, torture and pursuit. To quote one critic: "The Paladin is truly the most amazing, shocking and fascinating story to come out of World War II."

Other Garfield novels in the library are: The Hit; Recoil; Tripwire; and Wild Times. A couple of long-time patrons were overheard trading notes recently on favorite authors of whom Wilbur Smith and Jack Higgins topped their respective lists. Sald one bookworm: "If I could write-which I can't-I would hope to write like Smith. He's a master storyteller. No one can

word. His prose is lean and taut, with little was-

Once launched on A Falcon

Flies, readers will curse interruptions. Jack Higgins' Solo is the story of a duel between two evenly-matched characters, world famous pinnist John Mikall, and Asa Morgan, professional soldier, with Britain's Special Air Service. Mikali, an international hit man on the run after shooting a prominent London Jew, unavoidably knocks down and kills MOrgan's young daughter. Working completely in the dark, Morgan at last identifies his daughter's killer. Motivated by hatred, with revenge as his goal, Morgan hunts Mikali. Complicating the situation, Dr. Katherine Riley, America's foremost authority on the terrorist mentality is attracted to Mikali. Morgan, after meeting the psychologist becomes interested in her as a woman. Solo can be read piecemeal, but Higgins' fans will plot to finish it at one sitting.
