Rockwood Volunteer Firefighter's managed to save half a house belonging to Todd Kennedy in Eramosa Township Sunday night when fire gutted the upper story and demolished the roof. Believed to have been started by lightning, the fire originated in the attic of the residence situated on Third Line, Eramosa, above Highway 24. According to Fire Chief Carl Meadows an estimated \$25,000 damage was done. Firefighters were called out at 8 p.m. and were on the scene five hours.

The library is a joint venture of Eramosa Township and the Wellington County Board of Education and charges no membership fee for township residents, although non-residents pay the grand sum of a dollar a year per card.
