

checked with the Social Insurance Numbers of people receiving unemployment insurance benefits. Only cases of potential abuse will ever surface. After investigation, anyone found receiving benefits to which they are not entitled will have to repay them.


It may be an honest mistake. Some people forget or don't understand they must tell Unemployment Insurance and report their total earnings when they start






