 AMENDMENT NO. 9 TO THE MILTON OFFICIAL PLAN
 CHANGE FROM "RURAL" TO "INDUSTRIAL" SUBJECT LANDS

Please take note that the Council of the Town of Milton will hold a Public Meeting to discuss and explain a proposed amendment to the Official Plan of the Milton Planning Area.

Purpose of Amendment
 The purpose of this amendment is to change the designation of certain lands described herein from "Rural" to "Industrial".

Location of Lands Affected
 This amendment applies to approximately 29 hectares (72 acres) of land in the former Township of Esqueping indicated above and described as follows:

i) part of the Southwest Half of Lot 5 of Concession 3, and ii) bounded on the West by the Highway No. 25, on the North by the Campbellville Road (No. 5 Side Road), on the East by the Western limit of the proposed Nanticoke-Pickering Hydro Corridor, and on the South by a line that is parallel to the South limit of Lot 4 in concession 3 and situated approximately 115 metres (377 feet) North of that lot line.

Basis for The Amendment
 Amendment No. 7 to the Official Plan of the Milton Planning Area, changed the designation of 562 hectares (1,388 acres) of land situated to the South, Southwest and Southeast of the subject lands, from "Rural" to "Industrial". That amendment sets out the basis for the land use designation change in terms of the economic and employment benefits to the Town of Milton, locational and other factors of relevance.

It is now deemed appropriate to extend the area designated "Industrial" by Official Plan Amendment No. 7, so as to include the subject lands (see Map above) for the following reasons:

i) they possess the same locational and other characteristics as the lands previously designated "Industrial",
 ii) they are immediately adjacent to lands for which the existing use is industrial, and
 iii) they constitute a logical extension of an emerging industrial corridor extending along Highway No. 25 North of Highway No. 401.
