Acton native leaves GO

Acton native A.T.C. McNabb will leave his post as chairman of GO transit at the end of this month. McNabb will be replaced by former Peel Region chairman Lou Parsons. McNabb will continue working in public transit. Named GO's first chairman in 1974, McNabb will continue as a consultant to the province's Urban Transportation Development Corporation in setting up a partly elevated intermediate capacity transit system in Hamilton.

No money for RBG

A request by the Royal Botanical Garden for an additional \$80,000 grant has been "received and filed" by Regional Administration and Finance Committee. Councillors said to open up discussion on more money for the RBG would only mean opening the doors to every other group which went away dissatisfied earlier this year when council set the grants to charitable groups and agencies. "This has been dealt with on a one-time only basis... and that's the way it should be," said Burlington Councillor and acting committee chairman Steve Toth.

Milton Mayor Don Gordon said that as far as he is concerned "we tell them the books are closed... we simply haven't got any more funds to give." The RBG had been heavily criticized earlier this year when it received a Halton Regional grant of \$128,000 while some groups such as Burlington Red Cross, Halton Salvation Army, and Radio Reading Service received nothing... although they had all been granted funds in previous years. RBG Chairman of the Board J. G. Sheppard and RBG Director Leslie Laking, had asked for \$80,000 which they said was the shortfall predicted in 1980 funding. Mr. Sheppard said there have been severe cutbacks in maintenance and personnel this year in order to work with the funds available, but it is not working out. Mayor Gordon said that if the RBG was running short of money it should consider charging people an admission fee. "I've been down there just recently and you can get in for free. I'd pay to get in because it is well worth seeing," he said.

Recovery House again faces closure

Halton Recovery House is once more facing closure unless it can come up with more funding. It is a halfway-style house for eight people suffering from alcohol addiction. It is located in the Milton area and funded solely by grants and donations. This spring Halton Region granted the group \$4,000 and it was followed up by another \$4,000 grant from Oakville United Way. Halton Recovery House was counting on supplementary direct funding from the Ontario Government but this has now been refused. Therefore the only method left open to the group, according to Mr. Vivian said once a person has found a job, he would then be responsible to pay back the per diem.

Under the proposed agreement, a per diem rate of \$12.33 would be paid on behalf of each eligible unemployed client (resident of Recovery House) until a job is found. "It is our understanding that if Recovery House cannot make arrangements for financing, they may be forced to close the residence. They are answering a need in the community and are reported to be making good progress with members of our society who have fallen prey to alcohol," Mr. Vivian said. Regional Council is to consider the purchase of service idea at its next regular meeting.

Site F hearing in September

The Halton Region Ecological and Environmental Advisory Committee has been told an environmental hearing into the Site F landfill site can be expected in September. Speaking to the EEAC, Halton Regional Solicitor Dennis Perlin said the Environmental Assessment Board will hear submissions on Site F sometime in the month and he said hearings would probably be lengthy.

The EEAC has been concerned about Site F because there are two woodlots on the 246 acres which contain a rare form of pine community. Called a "swamp-moss-hummock complex," the two stands are considered significant by the EEAC. However, the group was told the trees will be felled in when Site F is developed so they are not injured. The group was also told Site F will be developed in stages so the entire area will not be
