The Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food sponsored the tour of three regions by 60 farmers aged between 18 and 30. The idea is to take the young farmers to see progressive farms and agri-businesses so they can see new technology

in action and learn how farmers are coping with rising energy costs and other problems.

Chudleigh's was chosen because it is a successful operation. When speaking to the young farmers Chudleigh stressed the importance of marketing your product. He boasts 6,000 patrons a day in peak picking seasons and each apple picked is an apple sold.
