Monday morning this street car was moved from the Halton County Electric Radial Railway Museum to the CNE. First it was loaded carefully onto a flat-bed and then trucked down the Guelph Line and along Highway 401 to Toronto. Car number 418 will be on display in Centennial Square during the Ex. It was built in Ottawa in 1925 for the Hydro Radial Railways and used on both the Mimico Line and for city service. Fifty years ago this month it was running on the TTC line from the city limits to Richmond Hill and then was reported scrapped in 1950. One of only eight cars built, the Electric Railway Museum tracked it down and bought it in 1973 from Hillsburgh resident Fred Spratt who was using it as a home.
