Region phone service 'pretty bad'

Telephone service at Halton Regional headquarters is so bad, the resolution of the problem cannot be put off until the 1981 budget, according to Councillor Walter Mulkevic.

Staff had been asked to look into numerous complaints from the public and councillors that people have trouble calling into the headquarters.

Chief Administrative Officer Ernie Reid has since come back stating it should be considered in 1981.

Mr. Mulkevic said the region has "pretty bad service" and that the Council had "an obligation to look at it."

But Mr. Reid said there just aren't any funds in the budget to have an expert come in and find the problem.

It may have been partly solved by Councillor Roy Booth, a man with 18 years' experience with Bell Canada.

He told councillors he would be glad to look into the problem for the region and he thinks he has a solution.

"To solve this... you have to repair the lines. The lines aren't being repaired properly," he said.

Mr. Booth said he has had his own problems calling into headquarters and said the malfunctions, in his opinion have to do with the lines at Halton Region.

Limehouse Lawsons fly to Frobisher

Mrs. Mouldin, reporting the Canada Day activities stated the photo of Gov. Gen. Commissioners not near public

He suggested and council endorsed a recommendation from the Town of Durham that more elected representatives be on police commissions. This is also a recommended change to Bill 151.
