**DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES**

ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 8TH. LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED IN ANY SECTION, BUT WILL BE PENALIZED AN ADDITIONAL 10%.

**RULES:**

(1). Exhibitors of purebred stock must produce registered certificates of pedigree. Pedigrees will be checked by someone appointed by the Society.

(2). All cattle being exhibited at the show will require a negative test for brucellosis conducted within 60 days of the opening of the fair, EXCEPT:

- (a). Official Brucellosis vaccinates under 18 months of age.
- (b). Calves under six months of age.
- (c). Steers.
- (d). Animals originating from Brucellosis free listed herds: and all entries must be accompanied by Health of Animals (Form 4).

(3). NUMBER OF ENTRIES PER BREEDING UNIT (DAIRY).

Only one entry per class is eligible from a breeding unit, except the Fair may authorize in up to two classes, a maximum of two (2) entries in sections 1-2-3-4-5, and a maximum of three (3) entries permitted in sections 6-7-8-9-10. Maximum total eligible entries from a breeding unit is ten (10) head.

(4). Protests - All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$10.00 which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Cattle Superintendent within 6 hours, after the occasion for such protest.

(5). The above rules will be strictly enforced.

3. In class 14, if there are more than 3 exhibitors of any one breed, then that breed will obtain breed status. If there are less than 3 exhibitors in any one breed or group of breeds, the Directors of the Acton
