RULES & REGULATIONS

The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as "breeder" and as "owner"—in both cases either as an individual or partnership. In other words, the exhibitor may be a "joint owner" of an animal end/or the "joint breeder" of an animal. Exhibitors are limited to one entry per section, however the Acton Fair Board have authorized two entries per section to a maximum of two sections, and the exhibitor has his choice of the sections in which to make his second entires.

NUMBER OF CLASSIFICATIONS FOR EHEEP

The following breeds must be shown in short fleece (steple less than 1 inch or 2.54 cm): Border Cheviot, Dorset, Hampshire, Oxford Down, Shropshire, Southdown, Suffolk.

Other breeds may be shown in short or full fleece at the discretion of the Fair.

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

All entries must have completed their Record of Performance (ROP) tost.

Prize money for all classes, except Class 31 (All other breeds) are as follows: \$20, \$17, \$14, \$12, \$10, \$8, \$6, \$5, \$4, \$4.

Prize money for Class 31 is: \$10, \$9, \$8, \$7, \$8, \$5, \$4, \$3, \$2, \$2.

SECTIONS

1. Ewe—"Two Tooth" (Two central permanent incisors). Second pair of permanent incisors may be fully up. Other two pairs of temporary incisors ("milk teeth") must be firmly in place. Born the property of the exhibitor.

2. Ewe - "Full mouth milk teeth" (all eight temporary incisors). Born

Get of Sire. (Born the property of the exhibitor) A group of three animals, full mouth milk teeth, by the same sire. Both sexes may be represented.

6. Breeder's Flock. (Bred and owned by exhibitor). A group of four enimals, both sexes to be represented. Each enimal in the group must have been exhibited in one of the preceding classes. All animals in a group to be of one breed.

SHEEP SPECIALS

7. A suitable trophy will be presented by the Acton Agricultural Society for the Champion Flock, any breed. Winner's name will be engraved thereon, and the trophy will remain the property of the exhibitor for one year, then be returned to the Secretary for the Fair prior to September 1st, 1981 for competition.

8. Best wether or ewe lamb shown by a boy or girl under 21 years of age. Age determined as of Fair day. Prize money for this section is as

follows: 65, \$4, 64, \$3, \$2, \$2. Donated by C.J. Airken.

9. Showmanship class open to boys and girls under 21 years of age exhibiting wether, or ewe tamb to be judged as follows: Showmanship 75 points, Lamb 25 points. Age determined as of Fair day. A suitable trophy will be presented to the winner of this class, donated by B.J. Garner.
