RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. STOCK TRACTOR RULES: Stock tractors must have no visual engine modifications, original pumps, no turbochargers unless manufacturer's option.
- 2. Three point hitches may be removed.
- Drawbar length 18", drawbar must be stationary, maximum height of 20" from top of hitching device parallel to ground.
- 4. No four wheel drives and no duals.
- 5. Weights must be securely fastened.
- 6. Orivers must be 18 years old.
- 7. Only Stock Fuel to be used by tractor.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. No one allowed on track except for officials and drivers.
- 2. Tractors must be operated in a safe manner.
- 3. Driver must be seated during pull.
- 4. No passengers
- 5. All tractors must stop immediately upon signal from Judge. The pull shall be considered over when forward motion of the load stops.
- 6. No drinking at track.
- 7. During hitching and unhitching tractors must be in neutral or park.
- 8. Violation of any rule will result in disqualification.
- 9. Each tractor will pull according to its own weight.
- 10. Rules for contest will be available on day of the pull.
