OBJECTIVES

1. To create greater interest among young people in caring for, feeding, developing and marketing of cattle and in the production and marketing of milk and milk products.
2. To develop a better general knowledge of breed type, and the judging and selection of cattle.
3. To encourage the improvement of the type and quality of cattle in the district.
4. To encourage the adoption of better feeding and management methods in the club district.

PROJECTS

1. To feed and care for one calf for the duration of the club year
2. To study recommended practices of feeding and management and keep records of the cost of production.

BASIS OF AWARDS

- (a) 200 points each for exhibit of calf at Achievement Day, and showmanship.
- (b) 100 points each for attendance at meetings, Quiz, Feed Reports, Farm Visit.
- (c) 150 points for judging.
- (d) 50 points for special project.

NOTE: Calves should be on the grounds at 9.30 a.m. Classes will be called at the discretion of the supervising committee.
