RULES

Excerpts from Rules and Regulations governing half exhibits.

All entries to be in place by 11 a.m. Friday.

All entries to be removed from hall at 4 p.m. Sunday.

Entries will be limited to one entry in each section.

All entries to be work of the exhibitor and exhibitor only.

The judges will have the discretionary power of withholding or reducing the prizes if in their opinion the articles exhibited do not merit them. The judges may also recommend additional awards if they consider them necessary.

The Society will take all reasonable precaution to insure the safety of articles exhibited, but should any articles be accidentally injured, lost or stolen the Society will not be responsible for the value thereof.

Correct address must be given on each entry form sent in by exhibitor. The Secretary will after the date set forth for paying the prize money via October 30th., mail cheques to the Post Office address as given on the entry forms. Cheques for prize money not presented on or before December 15, 1980 will not be honoured.

At the close of the exhibition, exhibitors must take charge of their exhibits and remove them immediately. No exhibit to be removed from the hall before 4 o'clock except by permission of the president of the Board of Directors.

Exhibitors are requested to have lists of entries in hands of the Secretary not later than Tuesday, September 16. Entry tickets will be made out ready to be picked up at the Secretary's office or mailed on request.

All exhibitors must be members of the Society before making entries or enclose membership fee of \$3.00 with entry list. (Classes where no membership required excepted).

The sum of \$3.00 will be retained by the Society for membership for 1980 for all those who have won prizes amounting to \$4.00 or over.

The Society will deduct as entry fee 10% of all prize-money won. This rule will not apply to classes where the entry fees are listed or in classes where no entry fees are charged.

The Directors reserve the right, if from any cause receipts for the year are not sufficient to pay the prize list in full, to pay such portion as the Board deems possible after paying necessary expenses.

Exhibitors are strictly prohibited from conversing or interleting with the judges while they are occupied as such. Parties violating this rule will not be paid the prizes that may be awarded to them.

While the Society will use every reasonable precaution for the protection of the public and exhibitors, they will not be responsible for accidents.

Any exhibitor violating any of the above rules will forfeit his or her prize money.

No entries to be removed from hall til 4.00 P.M. Sunday

It is recommended that due to the length of our fair, care should be taken regarding consumption of all exhibited food products.
