CNIB campaign now underway

The Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) campaign for funds is underway in Acton and the goal is \$3,500.

Once again Vic Bristow is heading up the September-long campaign and he has a crew of 85 people who will conduct the residential canvass while he will visit business and industry.

Bristow has been running the CNIB campaign for over a decade. This is the second year it has been

held in September, previously the campaign was in June. He said he wants to increase this year's collection by about \$100, for a total of \$3,500.

The CNIB relies on public donations to finance its rehabilitation and support programs for blind persons.

Loss of sight is a tragedy but living without sight doesn't have to be a tragedy. CNIB programs provide blind people with necessary skills so they can function in society.

director Tom Shepard unveiled plans for the new park which has been in the planning stages for some time.

The new Bovis park will feature a 460 foot long bicycle path, the first of many for Acton according to the Master Parks Plan unveiled earlier this year.

work. Eagle is also teaching a language course to grade eight students. "I'm looking forward to my new role as vice-principal, and the new teachers and the new students."
