Craig Bottomley took the sportsmanship trophy while David Reese walked off with most improved player on the Acton Chicken and Pizza Spot peewees.



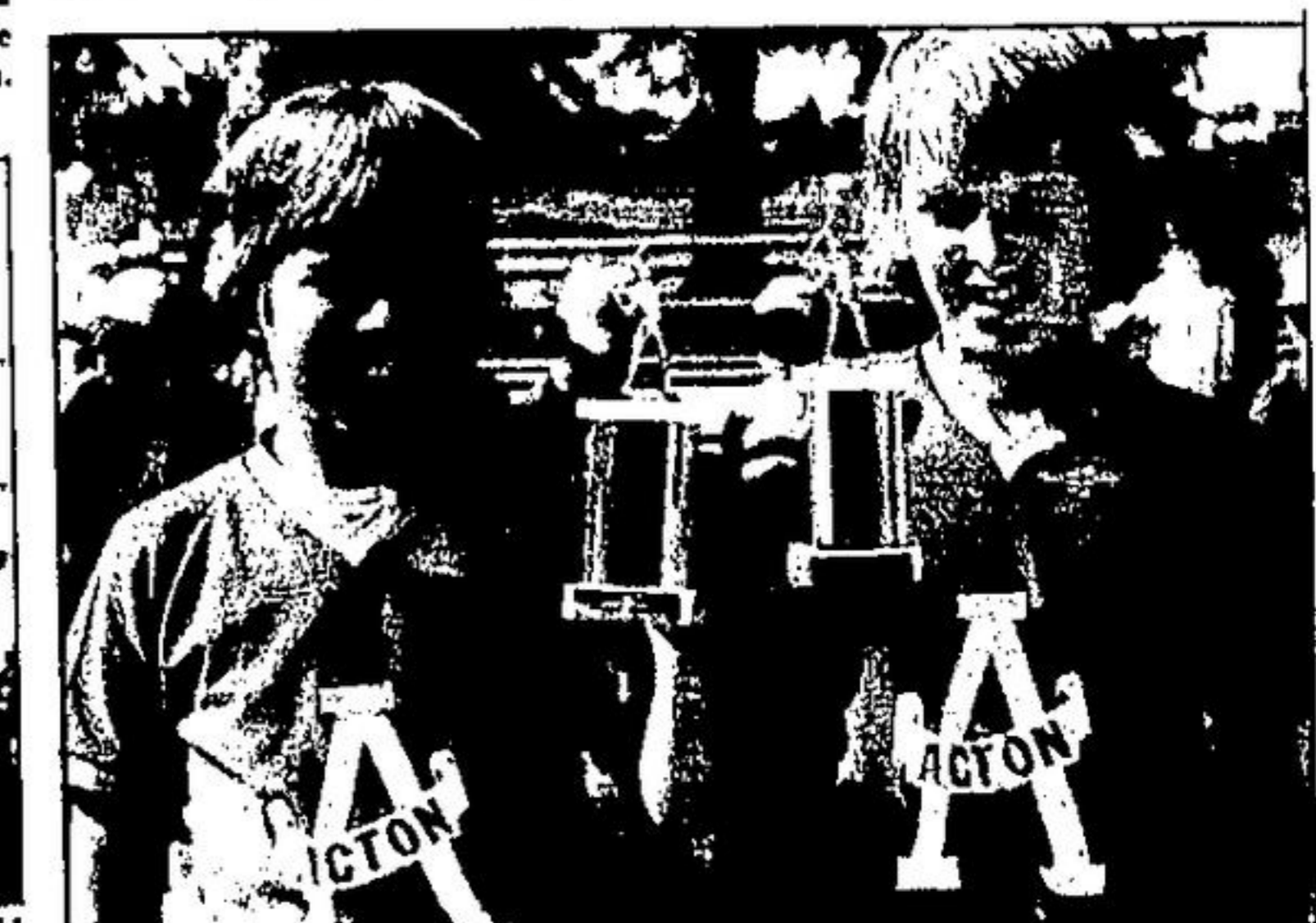
Melissa Fabian, left and Debbie Patey, right won most improved and sportsmanship for atom girls. They play on Tylers Tedbits.
