Jennifer Howes had a ball at the fair. First she visited the Acton High School booth and had a clown's face painted on her and then took a spin on the merry-go-round.

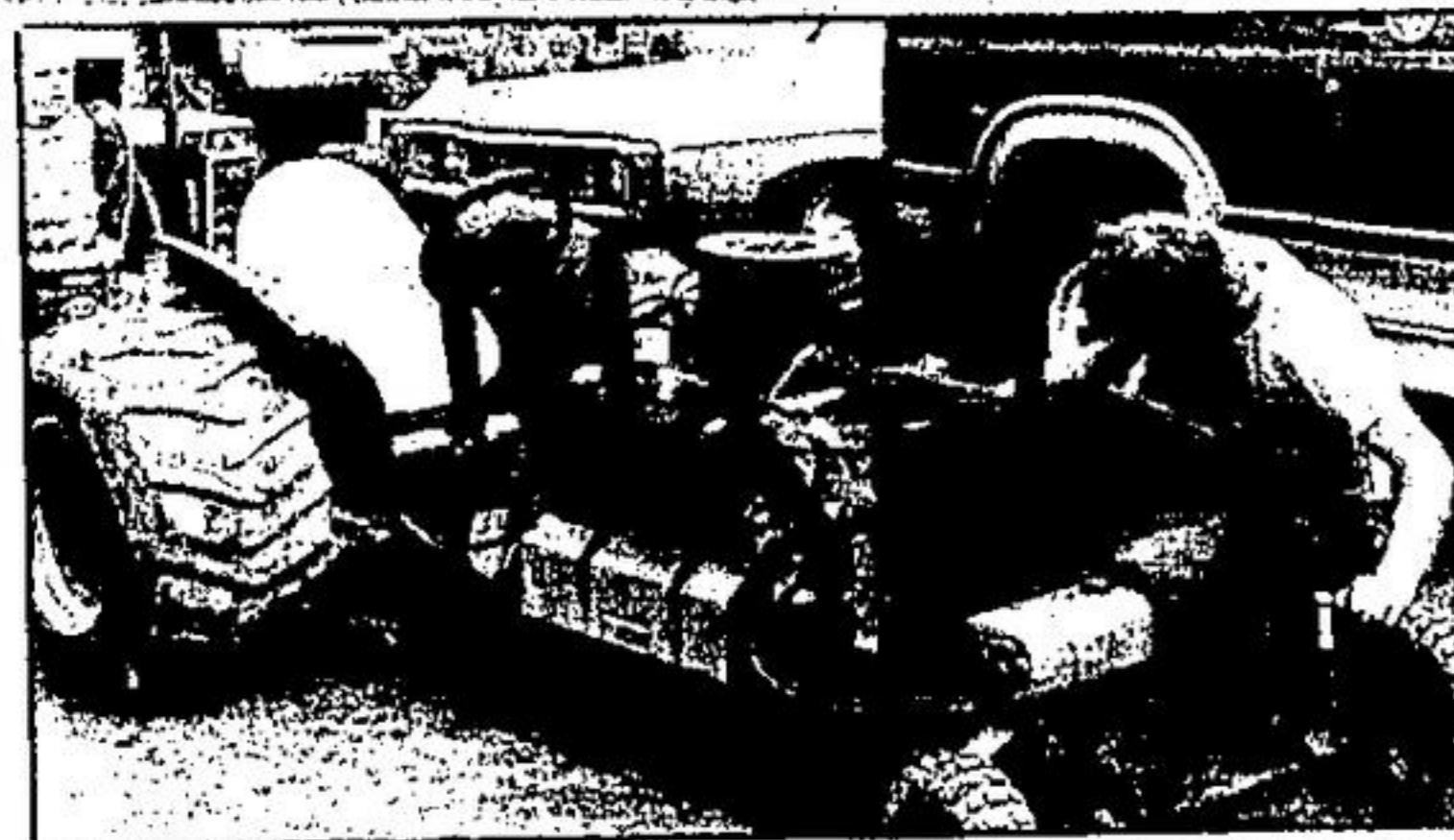

Acton Bull dogs anchor man Denzel Height of Rockwood, gets yanked across the grass by the Georgetown Golden Bears.



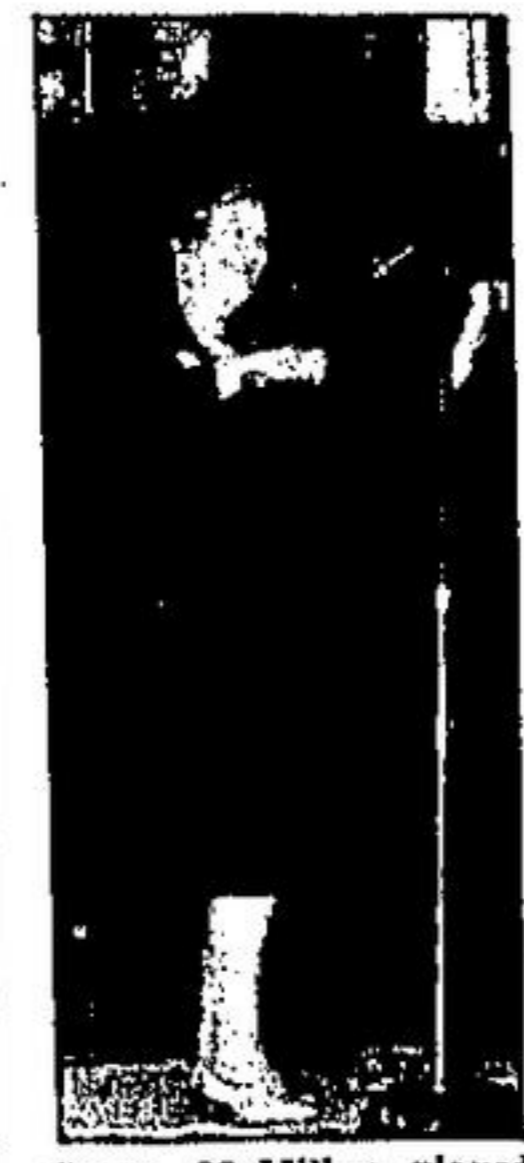
Teams of firefighters and their wives battled it out in waterball before damp fans.

Roma McMillan played at the fiddlers' contest.



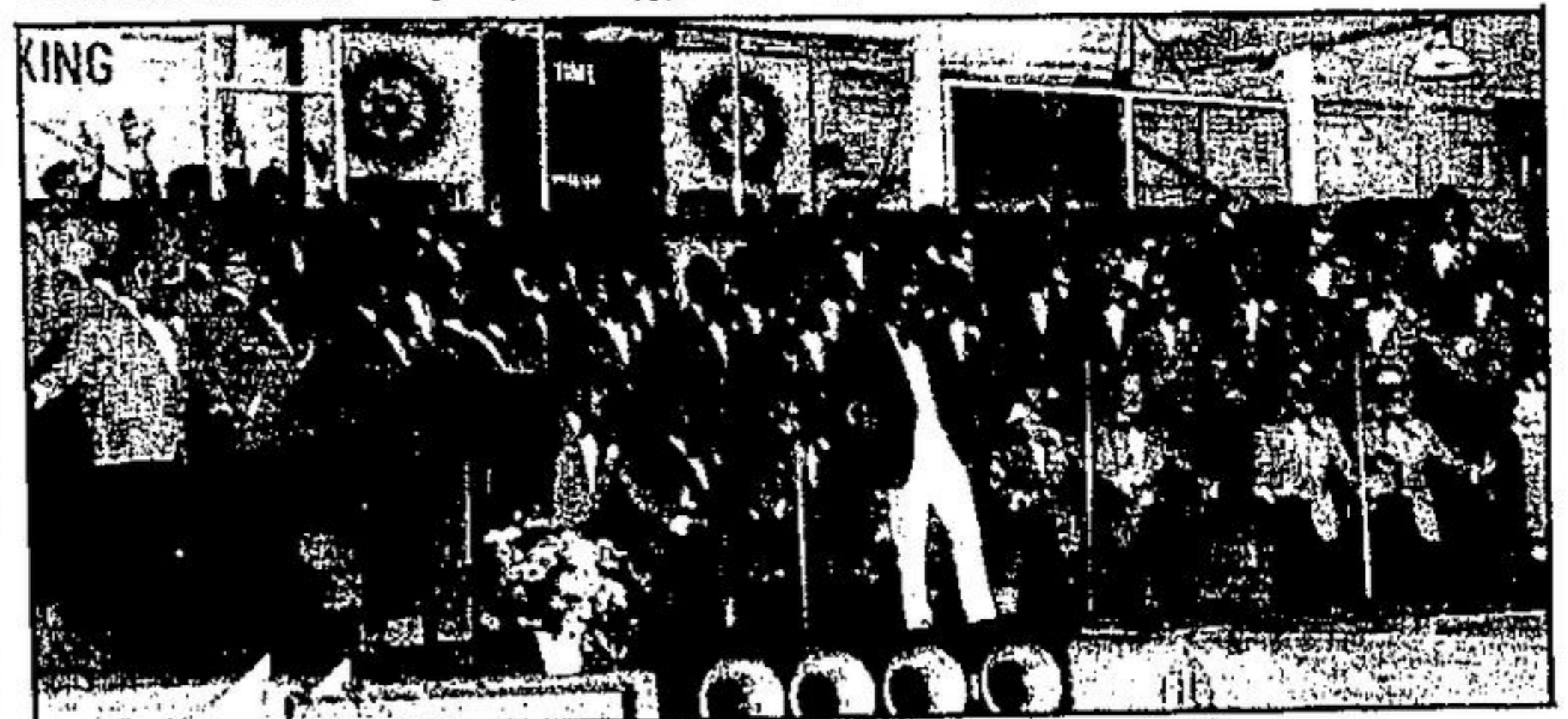
John McKay was one of hundreds who took a whack at cancer for Terry Fox at the L and L Ford exhibit.



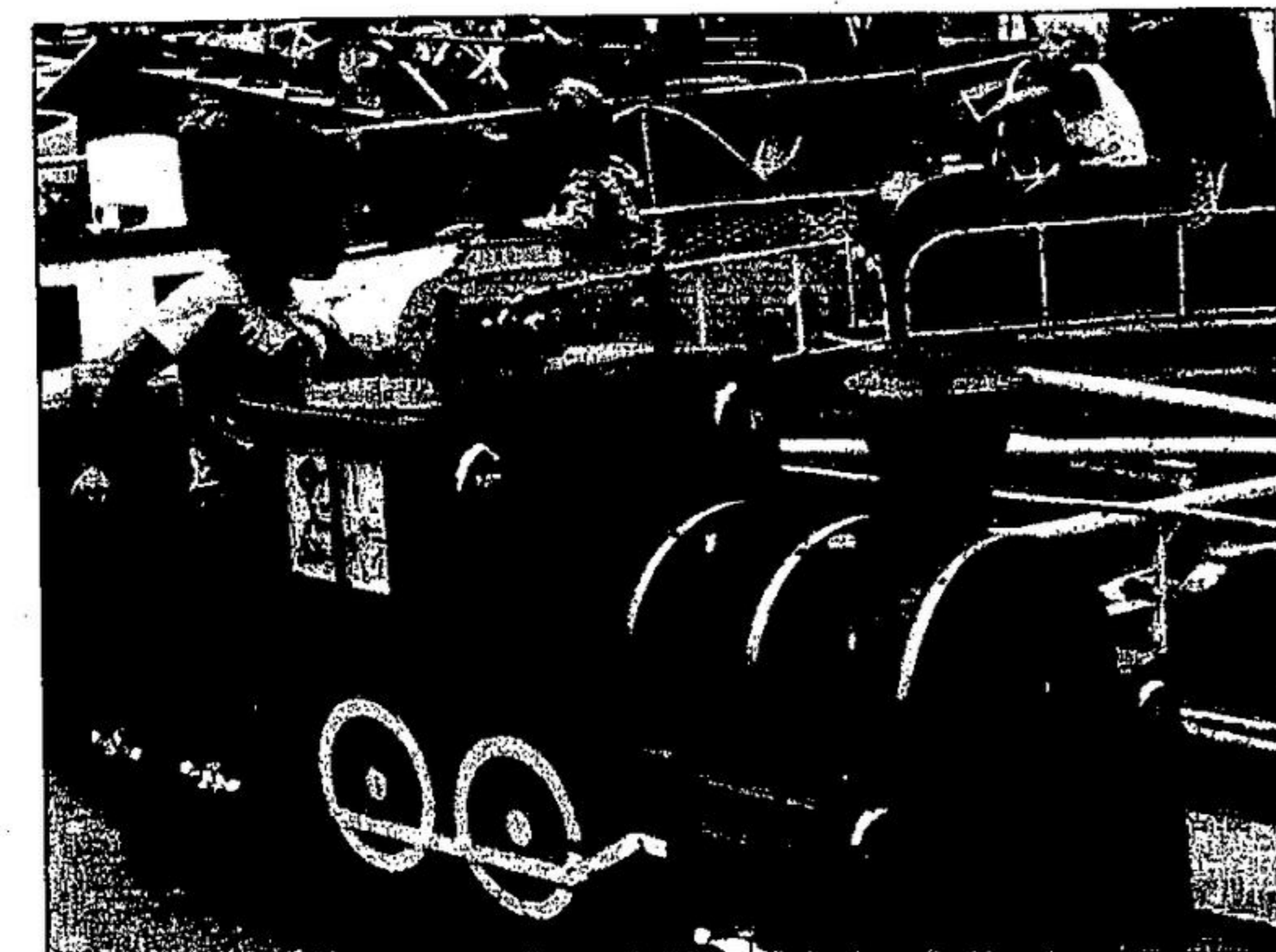

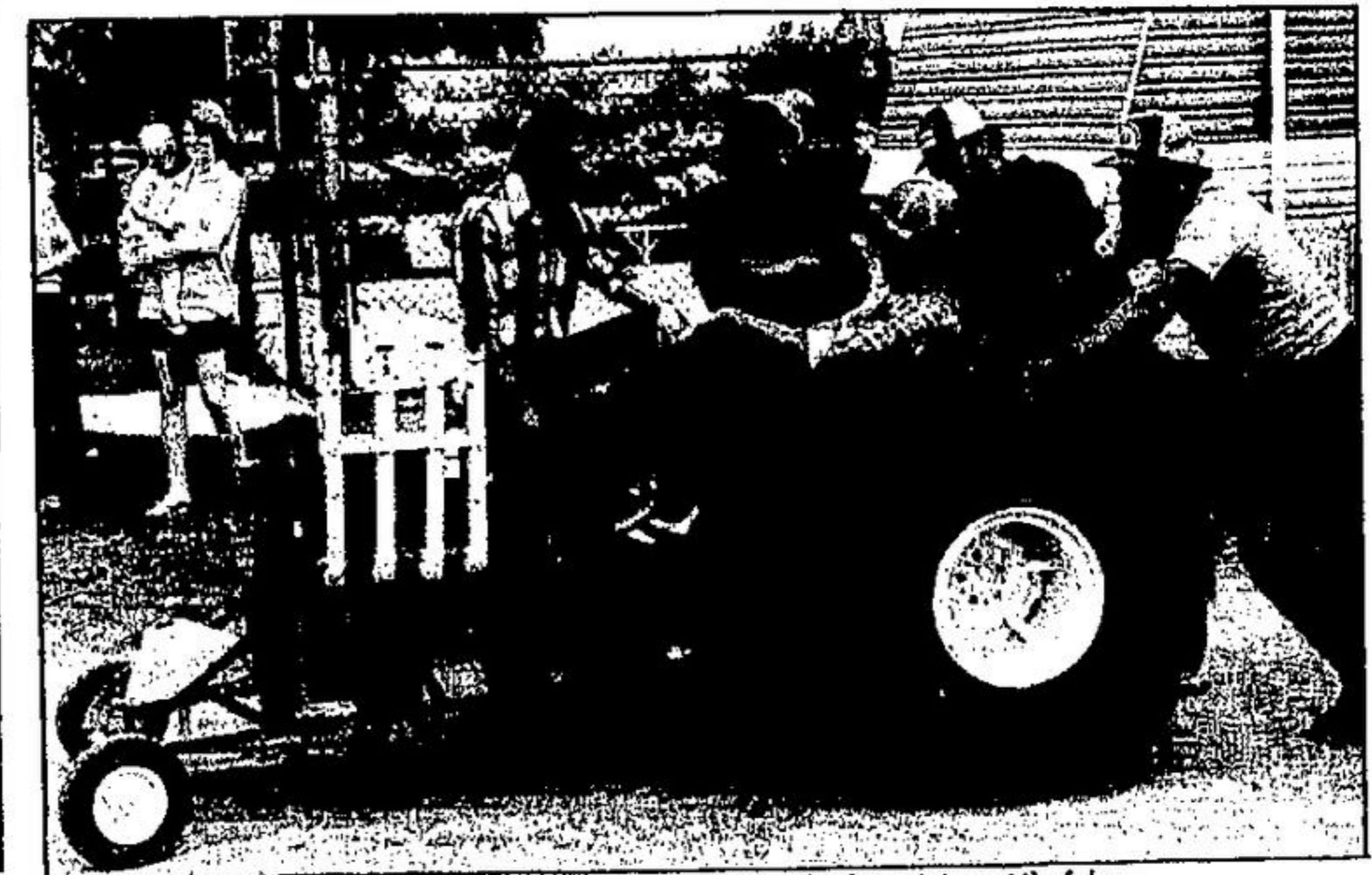
The Royal City Ambassadors, barbershop singers, were a big hit.
