Hinton quits trustee race

Arlene Bruce is all alone in the race for the trustee's seat on Halton's Board of Education. Until yesterday she had competition from veteran Halton politician H.H. (Bert) Hinton. He withdrew from the race. "I don't think there is enough interest or concern in the education budget," Hinton said as his first reason for withdrawing. His second reason was that he did not think there is public concern about integrity and morality of the education system in Acton and Halton. "Arlene is a very fine person and with experience will make a good trustee," said Hinton. Hinton went on to indicate where he thinks Bruce will experience difficulty on the board. "I think she will have great difficulty in negotiating salaries with teachers," said the veteran politician. "I don't think she has any experience with
