## Free Press blanks Fergus 3-0

The Acton Free Press Juveniles scored a 3-0 win over Fergus Monday night, after tying Waterloo Saturday 4-4 and dropping a 9-5 defeat Wednesday in Brantford.

Todd McIntyre opened the scoring in the first period Monday night, assisted by Scott Timbers and Denis Kirton.

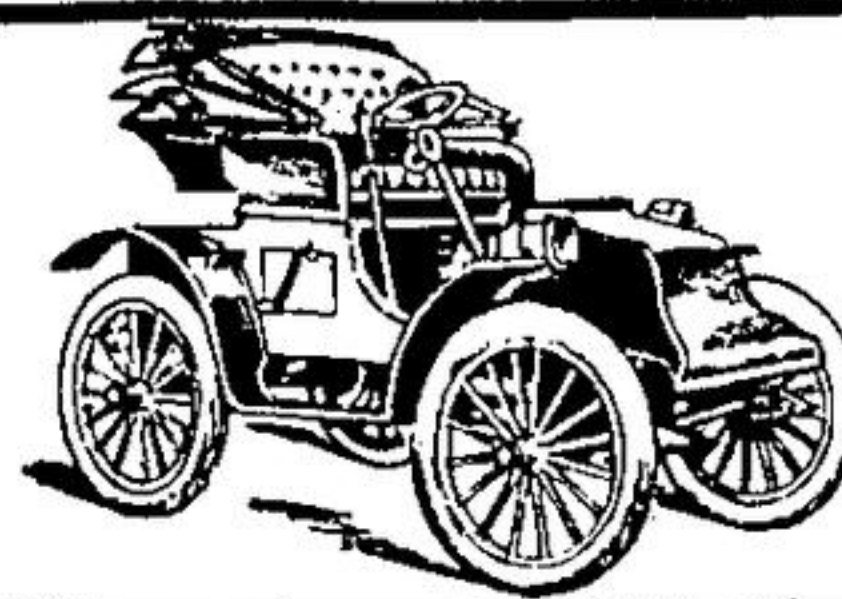

**DRIVE A HAPPY CAR**

**Tire Myth Deflated**

Taking air out of winter tires to get more traction is similar to drinking coffee so that you can get to sleep—it generally works just the opposite, warns the Automotive Parts & Accessories Association (APAA).

Check tire inflation outdoors where the temperature is the same as that in which you will be driving, not in a heated garage. Tire pressure drops about one pound per square inch (psi) for every 10° of temperature.

One decade-old winter tire tip now is old hat, APAA points out. Drivers used to be told not to travel over 50 mph for the first 50 miles of their new winter tires. Today, the assumption is that the driver will stay below the 55 mile-per-hour speed limit.
