If Halton Hills wants a garbage bin at the old dump on Churchill Road South or the sewage treatment plant the town will likely have to foot the bill. Councillors agreed Monday night that there is little chance the region will pick up the tab.

A report from the region Administrative Officer says operating and capital costs for a bin in Acton to reduce residential and rural area dumping would be about \$61,000.

Councillor Grubbe proposed region and town staff study the matter of a garbage bin for Acton further. She noted the operation in Acton would be similar to Georgetown's three day a week service at the old dump so the cost efof the fectiveness Georgetown operation should be reviewed. Grubbe would also like region and local staff to determine how many Acton and Esquesing residents take refuse to the Georgetown bin.

The town's request that the region spend \$61,000 for the bin and operation of the service will be reviewed when the region budget is struck next year.
