

Former local minister celebrates turning 80

A former minister at both Acton United Church and Churchill Community Church, Rev. Walter Fosbury, 124 Tudey Ave., celebrated his 80th birthday Friday.

Rev. Fosbury was at Acton United Church, the forerunner of Trinity United Church, from 1941-47. He retired from the United Church Ministry in July, 1969. However, he remained

quite active for several more years, serving as minister at Churchill from July, 1969 to September, 1975.

Rev. Fosbury was born in Alton, Hants., England and came to Canada with his family in 1913. The family eventually settled in Mount Forest and that's where he married Elizabeth Chalmers in June of 1934.

Rev. Fosbury received

some education in England but none in Canada until the fall of 1924, after writing high school entrance exams. He completed high school at Albert College, Belleville, in 1927, and received proficiency scholarships in 1924-25 and 1925-26 school years. Awarded a Governor General's Scholarship by Queen's University in 1927, he took a combined Arts and Theology program, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1931. The next year Rev. Fosbury earned his Masters of Divinity and in 1932 was awarded the Waddell Postgraduate Scholarship by Queen's Theological College.

Besides Acton and Churchill Rev. Fosbury also served as minister in Dobbinton, Allenford, Elmira, Hanover, Queensville, Prospect Park United, Toronto, Mount Hope, Hamilton and Moorefield.

Police hiring review

Police hiring procedures will be the topic of discussion at the next meeting of Halton Regional Police commissioners.

Police Chief James Harding said the commission is interested in a recently published report of a Task Force on "Racial and Ethnic Implications of Police Hiring, Training, Promotion and Career Development."

There have been very few racial incidents in Halton, said the Chief, but he added the force could benefit from studying the experiences of other areas.

He added the commission will also look at height and weight standards, but with no view to changing present procedures.

At this time the Halton force does not have set standards and the Chief said he does not want to restrict hiring to specific requirements.
