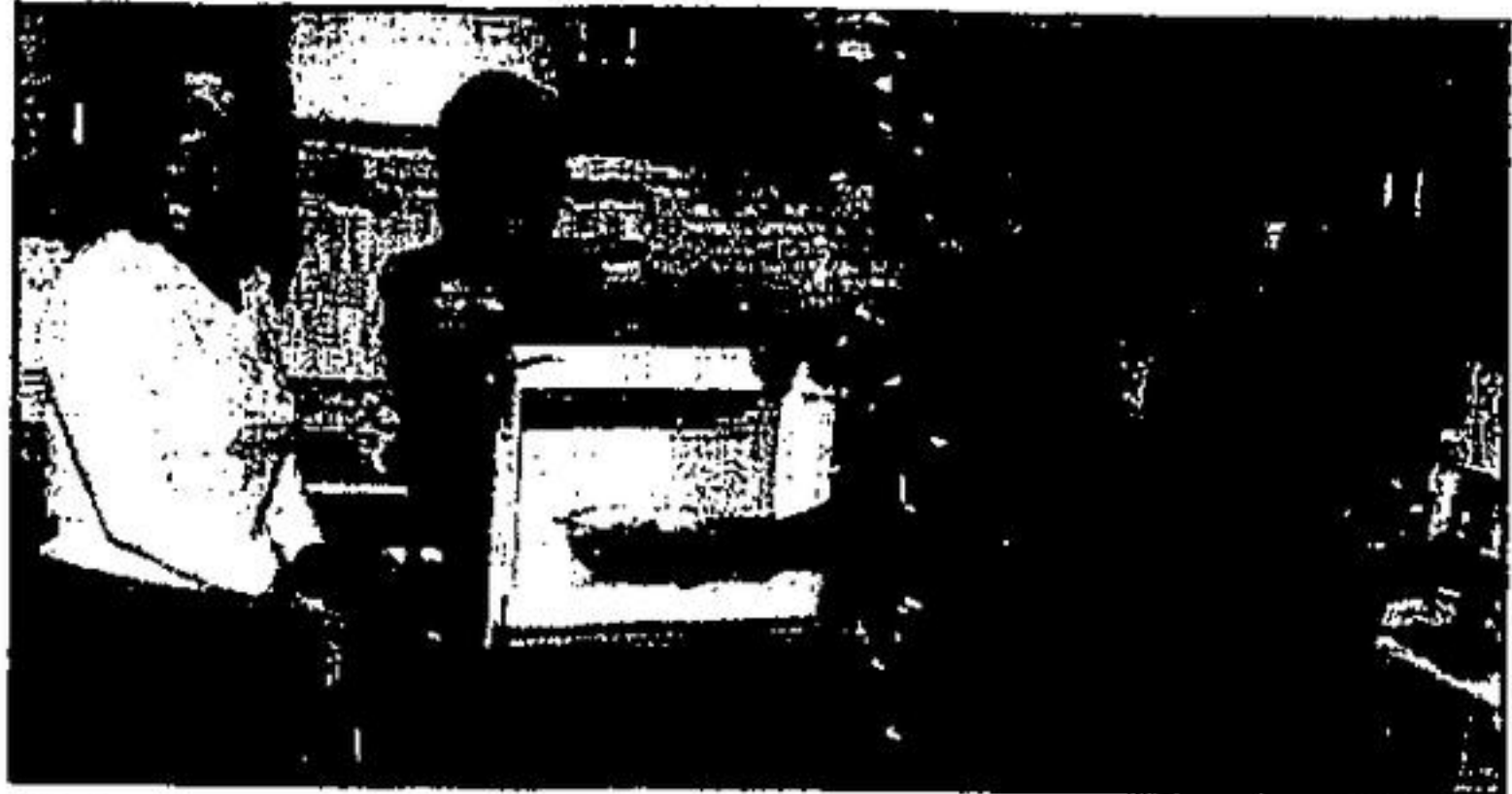

Searches start

Halton Regional Council has officially started to search for a new Regional Treasurer and a new Business Development Director. Former Treasurer Don Farmer stepped down in August of this year after the \$700,000 regional deficit came to light; and Business Director Bill Marshall resigned effective Oct. 20 to accept a post in Ottawa-Carleton. A firm of search consultants will be engaged to find a replacement for Mr. Farmer. In the interim, former Deputy Treasurer Jim Stewart has been Acting Treasurer. A special committee of Halton Mayors Peter Pomeroy, Harry Barrett, Roly Bird, and Acting Chief Administrative Officer Dennis Perlin will be interviewing finalists for Mr. Marshall's post. No date for completion of either search has been set.

Take notice that applications in writing to the undersigned will be received until 12:00 noon December 8th, 1980 from any eligible persons who desire their names considered for appointment to one of the following local boards and committees for the term indicated:

- A. HALTON HILLS COMMITTEE OF ADJUSTMENT
Two (2) persons to be appointed for a three year term who are not a member of the Council of the Municipality or an employee of the municipality or of a local board thereof.
- B. HALTON HILLS PARKING AUTHORITY
Three (3) persons to be appointed for a two year term who are qualified to be elected as a member of Council.
- C. HALTON HILLS PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD
One (1) person to be appointed for a three year term who is a Canadian Citizen, is of full age of 18 years, is a resident of the municipality and is not a member of any of the bodies entitled to make an appointment to the board.
- D. HALTON REGION SAFETY COUNCIL
Two (2) persons to be appointed for a one year term who are a resident of the municipality.
- E. LAND DIVISION COMMITTEE REGION OF HALTON
One (1) person to be appointed to fill a vacant position for one year term who is not a member of Regional or local Council or employee of Regional or Local Council.

- (b) The name, address and qualifications of the applicant and telephone number where they can be reached during business hours.

NOTE: One letter of application would suffice should applicant be desirous of applying for more than one position, however please state preference.

Rabid animals are still a hazard.

Rabies, which is spread by infected animals, continues to be a serious problem in Ontario. It is of special concern in built up areas where domestic and wild animals are infecting children who come in contact with them. Children should be warned to avoid stray pets, as well as wild animals, especially if they appear sick or friendly because these usually are signs that they are rabid. Pets should be regularly vaccinated and kept indoors at night. You can help to control rabies by reporting to your local police, humane society or health unit any pets or wild animals which are acting strangely. Do not handle your pet with bare hands immediately after it has fought with a rabid animal. Do not touch dead animals. Seek advice from a veterinarian. Contact your doctor or health unit immediately if your child or pet comes in contact with wild animals.
