

## Ed's bounce back from deficit

Ed's In-N-Out midgets bounced back from a two-goal deficit Sunday to take Kitchener 6-4 at the Community Center. That was their second win in as many games against the Flyers. They downed them 5-1 Thursday.

Kitchener scored the first two goals of the game in the second period before Wayne McMillan replied for Ed's at 3:40.

Kitchener scored once more with 3:19 left in the period, but Gord McArthur gave Ed's the final say at 12:57, on an unassisted goal.

Tim Ferguson picked up three assists, with a pair going to McMillan. Mohammed and Gary White earned singles.

Ed's completely dominated the scoring plays in a 5-1 victory over Flyers Thursday, with McArthur earning a hat trick.

They built up a 3-0 lead in the first period, with McArthur, Rob Vermuelen and McMillan connecting.

McArthur picked up his second goal at 4:11 of the middle period to make it 4-0, but then a goal by the Flyers spoiled Acton's shutout at 9:35 of the second.

McArthur made it 5-1 with his third goal in the final frame.

Two of McArthur's goals were unassisted, with Ferguson earning an aid on the first one. Mike Yalowica helped out on McMillan's goal.
