Rev. D. Sydney leaving Acton

Rev. Das Sydney of Acton Baptist Church will be leaving town at the end of the year to begin serving at one of the largest Baptist Churches in Canada.

He will be at Yorkminster Park Baptist Church in Toronto as of January 1.

Yorkminster Park has a congregation of over 2,000 people, which will mean a substantial change for Rev. Sydney whose current congregation at Acton Baptist Church numbers less than 100.

He will be one of three ministers at Yorkminster Park and will be working mostly in Christian education. Rev. Sydney, who has been in Acton since March of 1974, says his work will cover a "broad sphere, every aspect of church life." He will be co-ordinating and organizing Christian education programs for both adults and children at Westminster Park.

Transit system needs name

A search is on for a name for the transit service for the disabled, which may begin in Halton Hills at the beginning of April.

Barbara Stephens, vice-chairman of the advisory board of the service explains their program "Handi-Van", while Oakville has chosen "Care-A-Van." A catchy, dignified name to identify the service is what the advisory board is looking for, so have asked the public to help them come up with one. Suggestions should be sent to the independent office, 30 Main St. S., or to Barbara Stephens, 548 Main Street, Glen Williams.

The service cannot start until fund-raising projects are underway and the advisory board hears from potential funding sources, some of which are private.

The board feels it is most appropriate to launch the service next year, since 1981 has been designated "The Year of the Disabled."

Trustees introduced

New trustee Betty Jones was one of four introduced for the first time at the Wellington County Board of Education.

Jones represents Eramosa. The other new trustees are Dr. William Lawless, Ron Hallman and Sheila Fisher.

American firm study cemetery

A consulting firm is being called in to visit Fairview Cemetery and then submit proposals for both immediate improvements and a long range plan.


Earlier this year council heard complaints about garbage dumping in the cemetery as well as poor maintenance, lack of proper development of the cemetery and the need for improved landscaping. Some also suggested the cemetery was contributing to the area's mosquito problem.

Monday engineer Robert Austin asked Halton Hills general committee to place \$6,000 in the 1981 budget for planning of the cemetery. He also asked for approval for Grever and Ward, Orchard Park, New York, through Creative Memorials, Milton, to be brought in as consultants for planning of the cemetery. Austin noted by working through Creative Memorials the town will be eligible for a grant covering 20-25 per cent of cemetery planning costs through the American Monument Association.

Austin's report stated water levels in the northerly swale will be monitored during the winter until spring and there will be a comprehensive review of land planning. He indicated his department will have to spend some money on bringing up to date a survey of the cemetery as well as contour mapping. He added there are about 700 unsold plots left in Fairview Cemetery.

Once the review of lands is completed in the spring Austin expects the town should have a draft plan ready by late summer and a final plan settled by late fall.


He said the American firm of Grever and Ward uses planners, engineers and landscape architects and have done a number of projects like the Fairview Cemetery plan in Ontario in recent years. Councillor Roy Booth was concerned about proceeding with any cemetery study before the 1981 budget has been set but Councillor Harry Levy noted the cemetery could still be scratched from the budget when council reviews it in March. Levy added council has known since last summer that money would have to be spent in 1981 on a cemetery plan. Austin said after preliminary work is completed he will be coming back with proposals and seeking financial approval.
