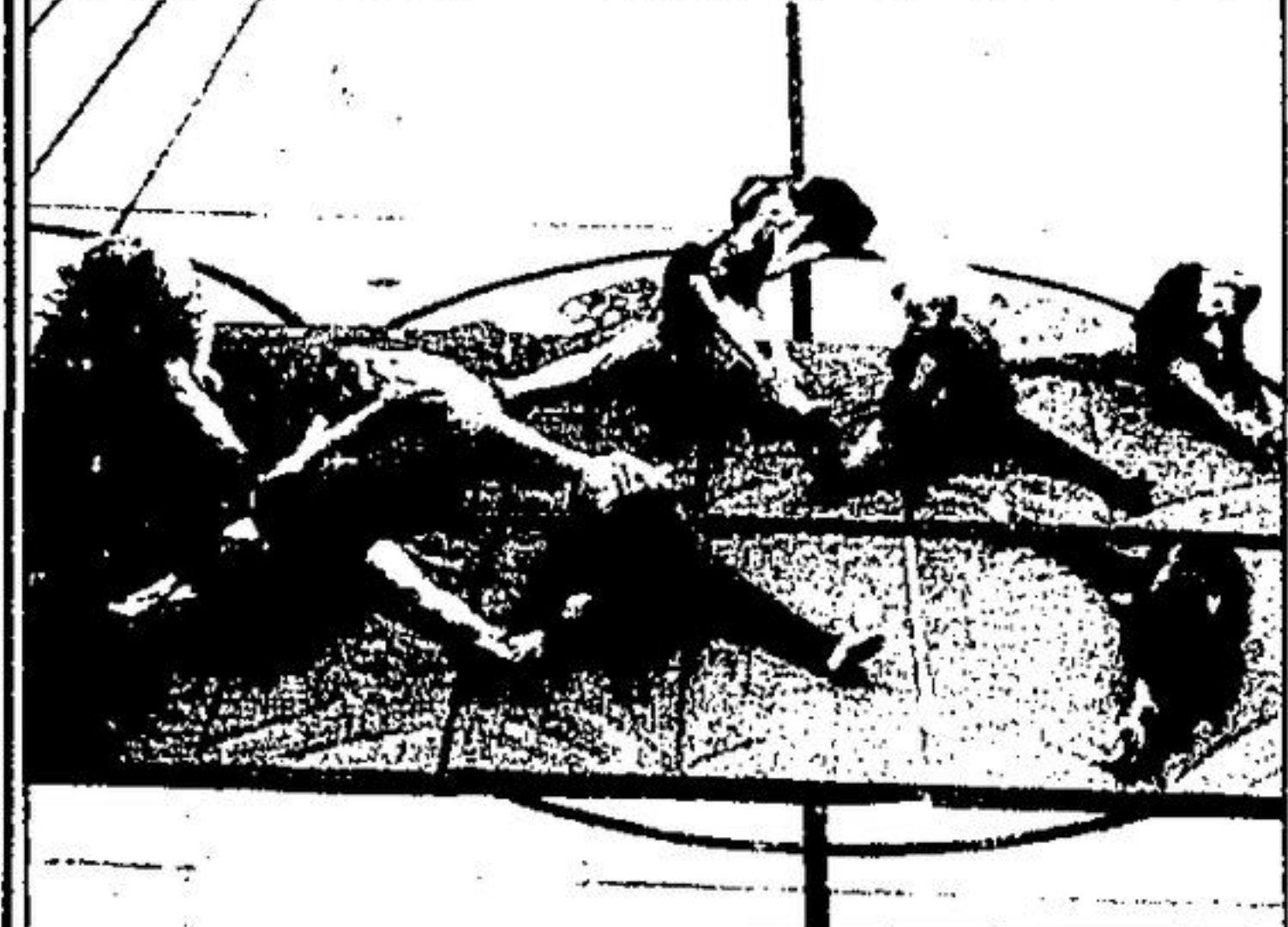




Instructor Trish Renton helps Christine Hess during her roll along the low beam.



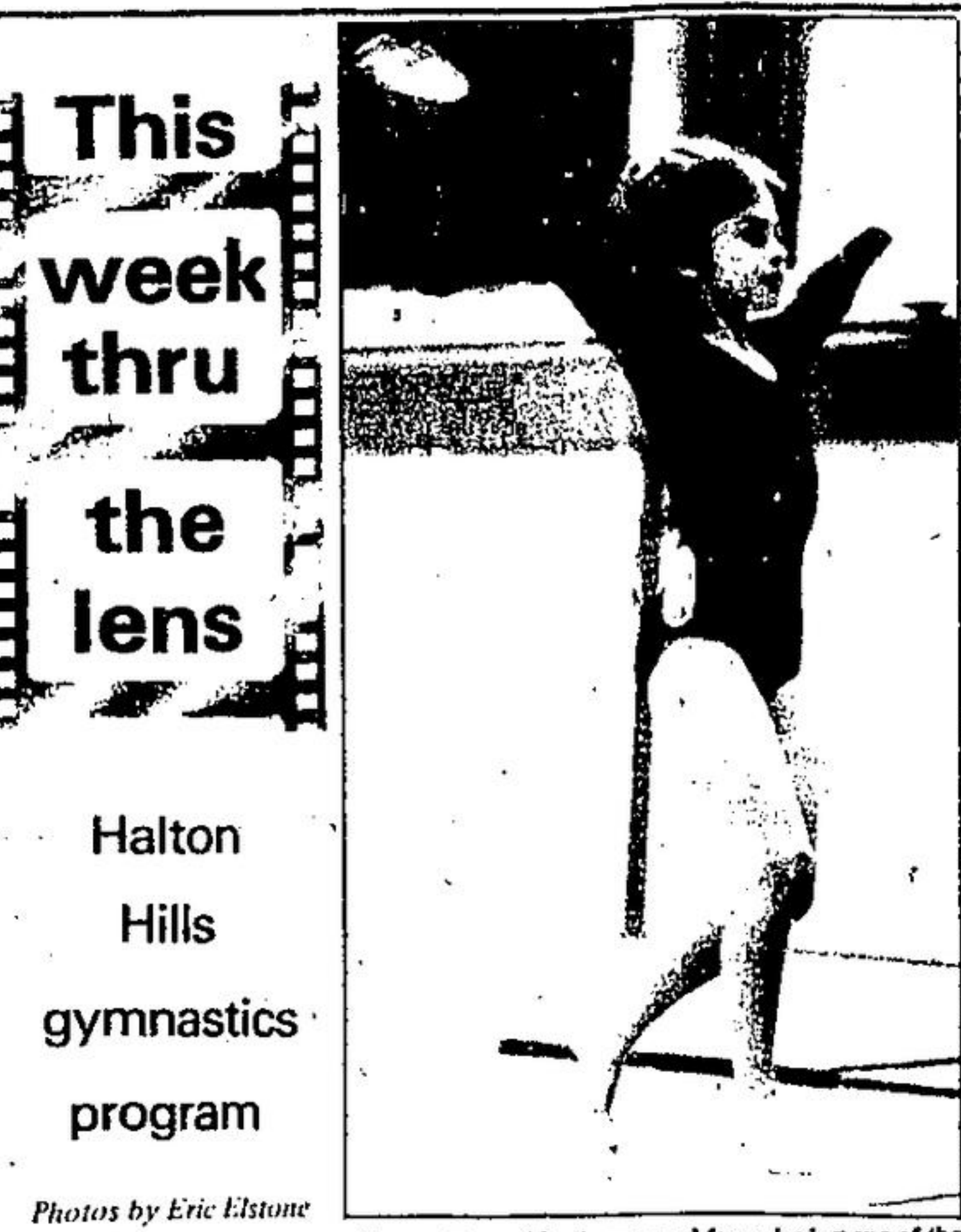
The town's recreation department offers gymnastics for youngsters at McKenzie-Smith Middle School.

 Halton Hills gymnastics program

Hope new St. Joseph's designed by end of March

Halton Separate School board hopes to have architectural sketches of the new St. Joseph's School to be built on Mill Street, West, ready for provincial approval by the end of March.

Halton Hills Trustee Irene McCauley has been keeping in close touch with director of education Cliff Byrnes regarding progress on the new separate school for Acton. Byrnes was in Acton last week to discuss the new school with the St. Joseph's Parents' Association.

Municipal planners have suggested because it isn't certain there will be sewage allocation for the new school to be built on a five acre site which is really in old Esquesing Township not Acton, the architect has been told to design the building with a septic system in mind. However the board hopes the school can eventually be hooked into the municipal sewage system.

If rezoning of the property goes through without a hitch and plans are approved the board is aiming for a spring site excavation late summer start on construction and occupancy of the new school as soon as work is completed, hopefully early in 1982 likely in the spring.

The new school will be a permanent, fixed type building, not a modular school, Vince Whelan said.

Sketches will be submitted to the Minister of Education for approval before the project goes to tender, McCauley reported. The province must also approve the tenders.

The new school is being designed as a kindergarten to grade eight facility, but the architect was also instructed to incorporate a special education classroom into the design. The site lends itself best to a bi-level building.

In early December the board's property and planning committee recommended to the board that a special education classroom be considered for the new school and it was later approved by all trustees. Byrnes said hopefully the special education classroom can be paid for out of the present grant allocation for 1982, \$1 million.

However, there is a possibility the board will need extra money from the province to be able to add a special education classroom.

Byrnes said the province has indicated a willingness to listen to requests for more funds from the board if more money is needed.

Just to build a classroom, four walls, a ceiling, and floor costs between \$50,000 and \$60,000, he said.

Byrnes explained equipping a classroom must be added on top of the construction cost. Equipping a special education classroom can be quite costly, costlier than a normal classroom, because there is one third the number of pupils usually so per pupil cost is substantially higher and different equipment is needed in a special education room.

The property and planning committee, on which McCauley sits, decided there was an "urgent need" for a special education classroom. McCauley noted when the committee discussed adding a special education room the possibility of having to ask the province for more money was considered.
