## Both towns eligible

Both Acton and Georgetown will be eligible for downtown revitalization loans the province has revealed. Halton Hills wants to apply for funds under the Main Street Revitalization Program, but provincial regulations allowed loans for just one downtown per municipality.

Monday council received a letter from Ontario Minister of Housing Claude Bennett who said he will permit the commitment of more than one downtown redevelopment loan in municipalities which have more than one downtown.

Last year the town successfully pushed the province to change its population ceiling for eligible municipalities from 30,000 to 35,000, noting the province created Halton Hills with a population over 30,000 so Acton and Georgetown shouldn't be excluded just because they were part of an amalgamated municipality.

Bennett said he is prepared to consider applications for \$150,000 in downtown revitalization loans for both Acton and Georgetown.

He also said the province will give downtown study grants of \$5,000 or 50 per cent of the study costs, whichever is less, for both the Acton and Georgetown downtowns.

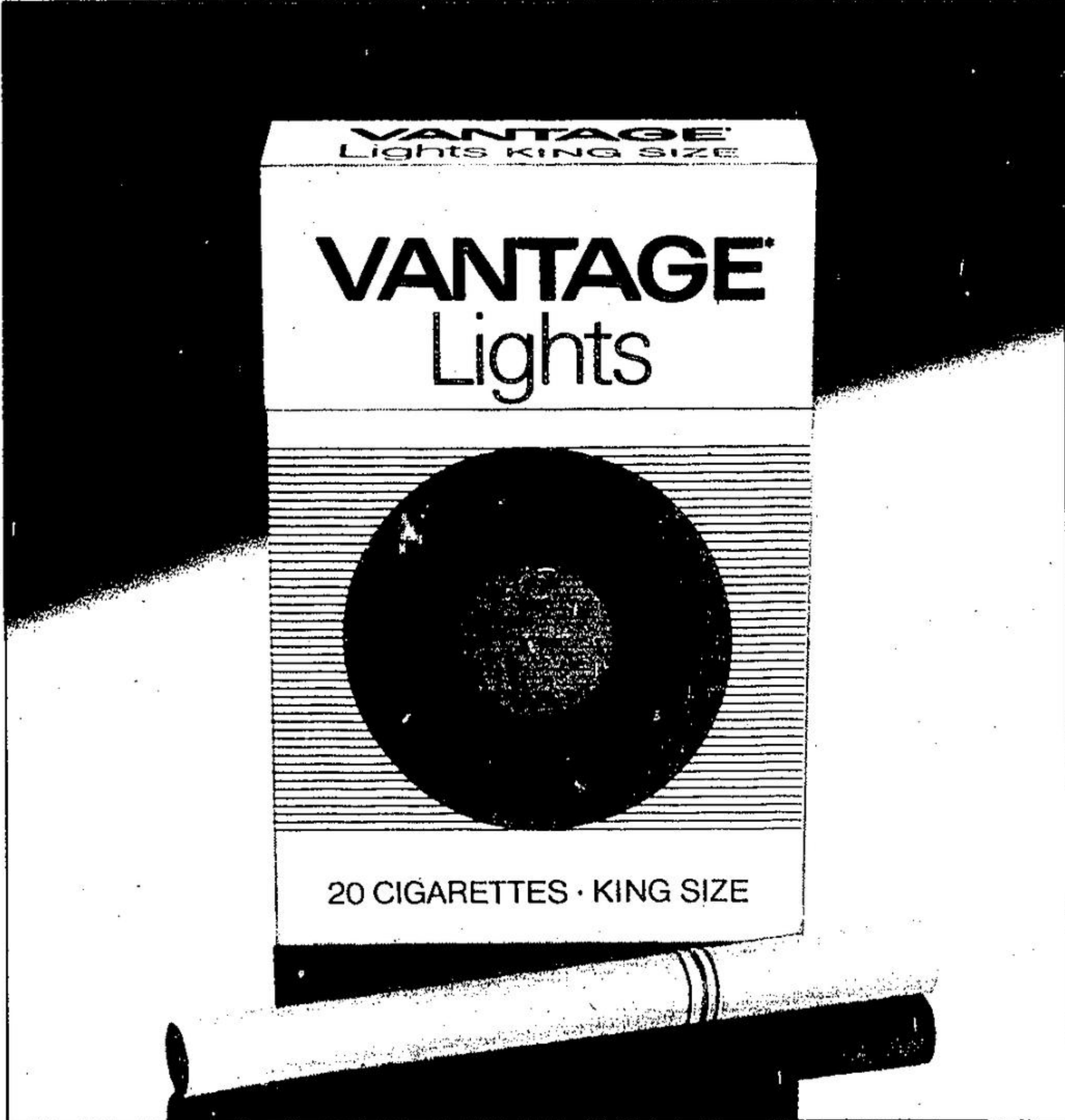
