AHS band to Huntsville, performed in 275 piece band

Acton High School's band enjoyed a three day trip to Huntsville for a band exchange last month. It was a tremendous success. Before leaving for Muskoka the band gave a concert at McKenzie-Smith. This concert went very well, and one of the highlights was having one of the students conduct the band for their performance of Soul Explosion. Students took advantage of the bus ride up north to read, talk and

contemplate the type of billet they'd each enjoy in Huntsville. One member even brought along a portable stereo so music filled the bus. The band members stopped in Gravenhurst for lunch and then explored the downtown area of the community. After arriving in Huntsville the students went to the homes of their billets and met the families they'd be staying with for a few days. The band also made a presentation to the leader of the Huntsville band. In the afternoon the Acton students went skiing and swimming at Hidden Valley. That evening the local musicians enjoyed a pot luck supper at the school followed by a sleigh ride and then went to one billet's house for a party. Later they also visited an arcade. The next day the AHS band went back to the school and said goodbye to the many friends they had made in Huntsville before leaving for home, stopping in Barrie for a meal. 
