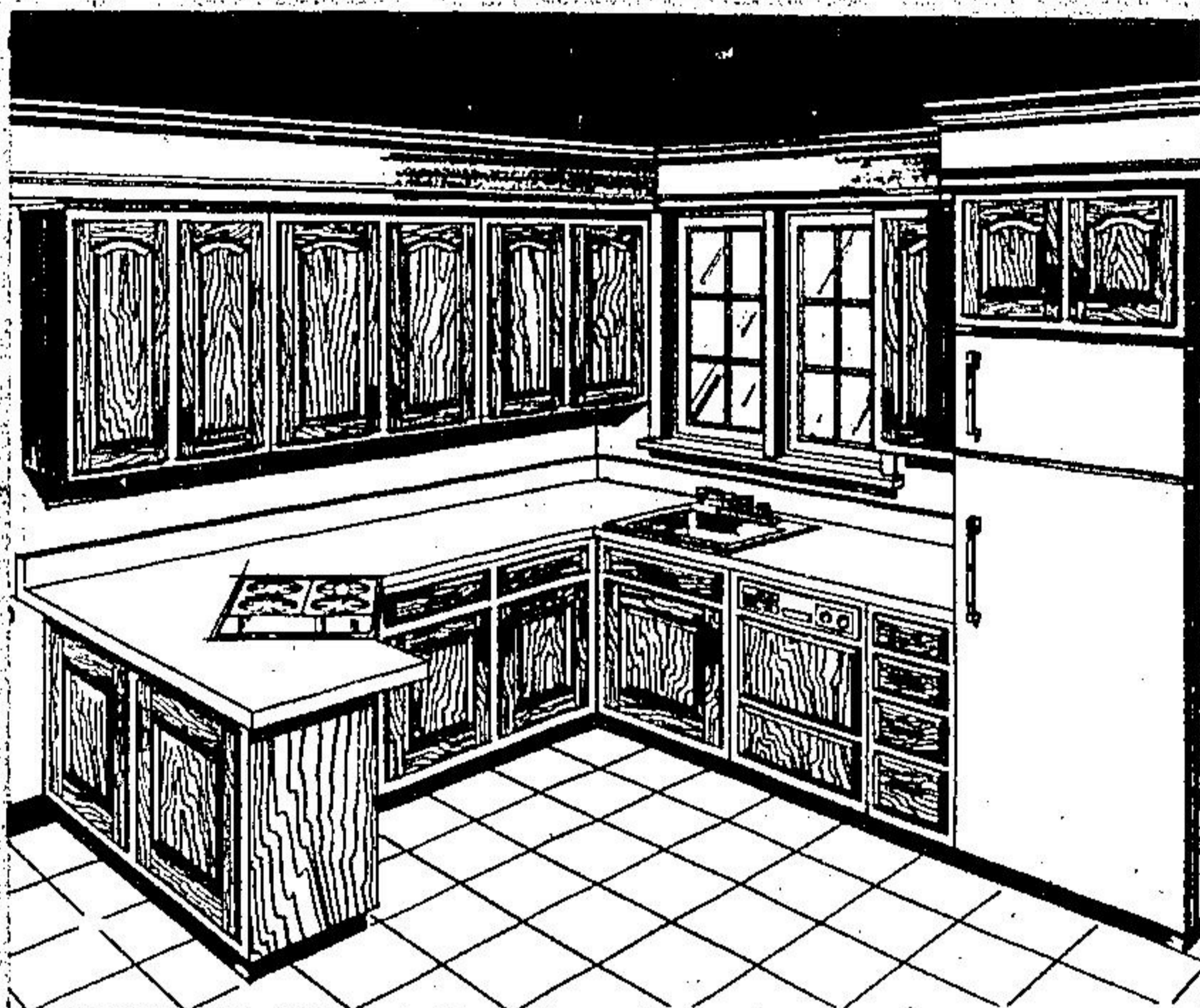

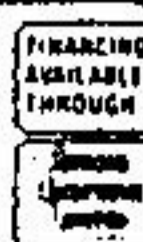

What's Going On?

Spring is in the air

Spring is in the air at the Erindale Campus, University of Toronto. The public is invited to attend the Campus greenhouse, open house on March 28 and 29 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The greenhouse, used as a research and teaching facility by the biology group, is located at the Erindale Campus, south building, room 5036.

There will be approximately 1,000 different species of plants on display and the show will include tropical, arctic, desert plants, herbs and fungi. There are also more than 100 species of cacti and succulents and a few unique plants often considered to be living fossils. Admission is free.

Well women week

A week-long program of activities to help women get healthy and stay that way will be held at the Brampton Campus of Sheridan College in April.

Co-sponsored by the Centre for Women and Health Services at the campus, Well Woman Week has a theme of Celebration, and will run from April 6-10.

Events planned for the week include a demonstration of self-defence techniques for women, displays, workshops on stress management and assertiveness, fitness testing, and a discussion of breast self-examination.

A seminar on sexuality, a talk on occupational health and preventative medicine, and a feminist-oriented cabaret performer will also be featured.

Maple syrup festival

Families looking for a fun day in the spring sunshine should make note of the fifth annual Maple Syrup Festival at the Orangeville Reservoir Conservation Area. Sponsored by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority, the Festival will take place on March 21-22, 28-29 and April 4-5 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The area can be reached by travelling north on Highway 10 to Orangeville and following the signs.

A horse-drawn sleigh or wagon will provide transportation inside the area, picking up and dropping off visitors at various points. A self-guiding maple bush trail will lead to the sugar shack where demonstrations of Indian, pioneer and modern methods of maple syrup making will be explained.

Muppet Movie cancelled see Battlestar Galactica

The Muppet Movie scheduled to be shown at the Acton and Georgetown Libraries during the March break next week has been cancelled. Instead youngsters will be able to enjoy Battlestar Galactica. The Muppet Movie was booked by the South Central Regional Library System from "Bellevue" distributors. This company lost the rights and Universal films now own the rights to the Muppet Movie. Universal was unable to honor the March break booking. Battlestar Galactica will be shown at the Acton Library this Tuesday at 10:30 a.m. and at Cedarvale Gym in Georgetown the same day at 2 p.m.

Waterloo courses

Acton public library will be the setting of three University of Waterloo courses this spring. Subjects will be Ontario's literature, family therapy and educational psychology. Lectures may be attended free of charge for personal interest, or they may be taken for university credit. For students over 60, the courses may be taken for credit free of charge.

The literature of Ontario will be offered Monday evenings, 7 to 10 p.m., by Dr. Stan McMullin, director of UW's Canadian studies program. Lectures will begin April 6 and continue to June 22.

Tuesday evenings (beginning April 7), Allon Bross of UW's Renison college will discuss family therapy. The twelve-week course will focus on the understanding and treatment of family problems and their causes, and will be part of a certificate program offered by the college.

A course in educational psychology will be offered by Ted de Young Thursdays from April 9 to June 25.
