## Branch 197 celebrates Golden Anniversary

The Acton Legion, Branch 197, would never have reached its 50th anniversary without the "heartache," hard work and "vision" of its charter members and World War I veterans provincial president Ric Collins told the audience of about 200 members at Saturday night's Golden Anniversary banquet.

While it was a night of good spirits, described as casual and informal thanks to master of ceremonies Max Storey, it was also an evening filled with emotion and appreciation for the historical significance of the moment.

John McHugh led the crowd in the singing of "O' Canada, Vic Patrick passed the blessing and World War I vet Billy Middleton gave the Toast to the Queen before the buffet dinner. The colors were also trooped in.

Following the meal Storey introduced the head table of Gord McCutcheon, Halton Hills Mayor Peter Pomeroy, Halton MP Otto Jelinek, Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed, Legion president Pat Waldie, Ladies' Auxiliary president Jean Earle, zone commander Frank Buntin, district commander Joe Kobolak, Dominion vice-president Dave Capper and Collins.

The honor of introducing the two surviving Charter Members, Fred Wright and Jack Milne went to Bob Angell. He also introduced World War I vets Middleton, Bob Turner and Jim Ingles. The town's plaque will arrive next week. The district and zone presidents also had words of praise for the 50th anniversary accomplishment.

Corey Herrington and Ken Grant of Herrington Printing presented framed art work which was part of the 50th anniversary book.

Twenty-five year service pins were given to Jim Feenstra, Charlie Hubble, Margaret Lambert, Jack Pink, Frank Spielvogel and Norman Roy while 30 year pins went to Earl Beerman and George Hall. Arnold Perry, who was absent, will also receive a 30 year pin. Thirty-five year pins

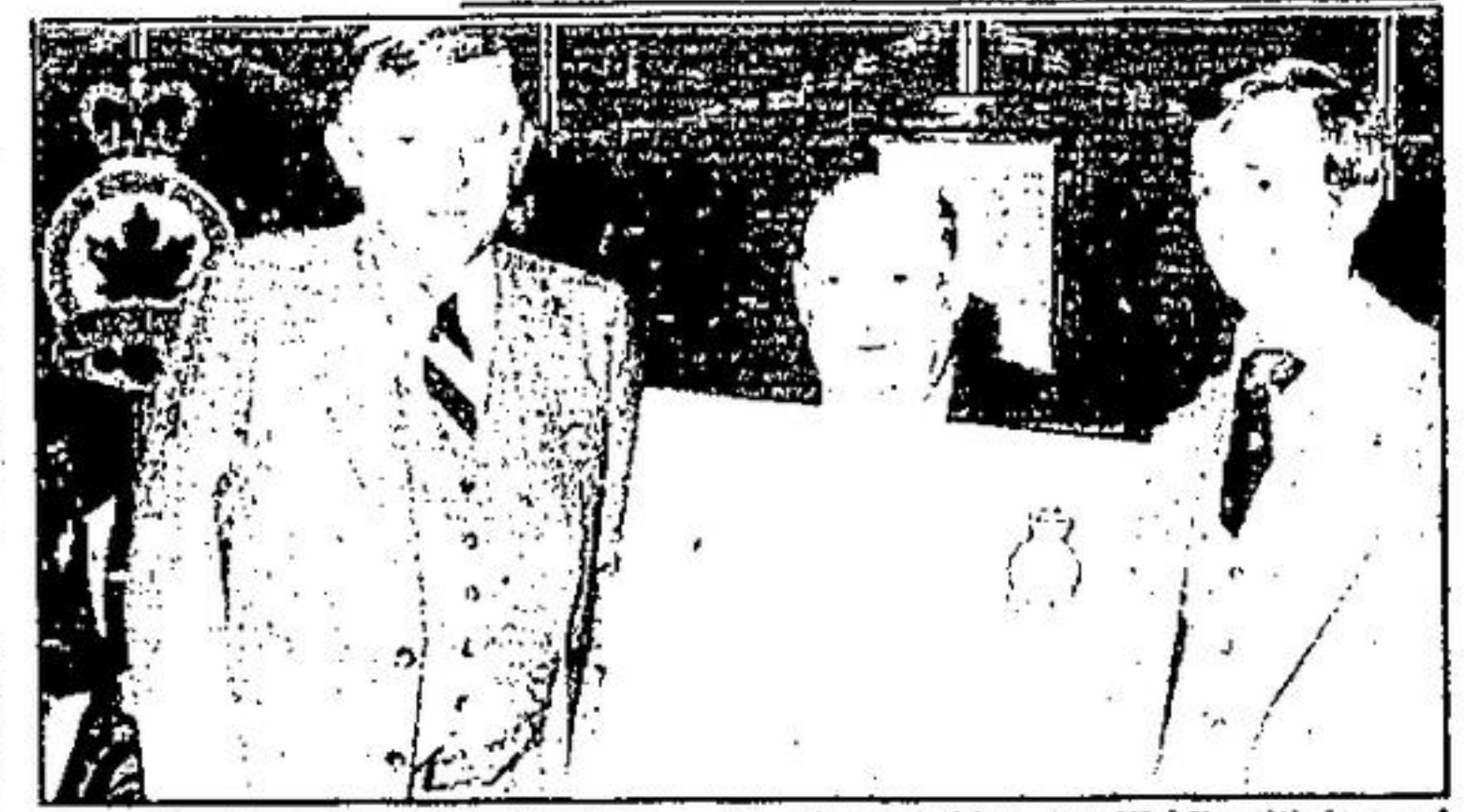
A certificate of merit was presented by Waldie and Goy in recognition of the countless hours of effort Joe Hurst put into producing the Golden Anniversary history.

In his remarks Collins praised the role of Legions in communities, noting Ontario branches and Ladies' Auxiliaries have in the past year contributed over \$6 million for youth organizations and sports, hospitals and veterans' programs. "We really are a viable organization" and an important part of the community, Collins declared.

He said in Ontario the legion has 170,000 members, or really 170,000 families.

Collins said Canada has the best pension legislation in the world for its veterans, but it could be better and Legions are working for improvements. He urged all Branches go out and find widows who are eligible for assistance.

He said he was glad to see some associate members in the audience, noting the "torch" will be passed to them. The associates will take over a great "trust" and "responsibility" to keep the Legion going strong. The Legion is too important to the country and Canada's citizens to let it die.

investments which yielded the Town over \$100,000. He warned no one knew what the resource equalization grants would be in 1982.

The \$7,056,669 total operating budget contains \$1,083,065 for capital projects, thus cutting out debentures and resulting debt charges.

After many budget meetings \$400,719 was pared from the budget. In reducing the recreation budget the acquisition of land at Cook and Holmesway, and a footbridge and paths at Bovis Park were cut down.

### 50 golden years...

In 1961 Legion members agreed to raise funds for alterations to the Acton Arena and raised \$82,000.  
Legion choralliers went to Expo in 1967 to sing for the world.  
By 1973 Branch 197 had outgrown their Main Street north location and were looking around for more space. They settled on ten acres on Mill Street west, the Legion's present location. Six acres were later sold for subdivision development. The sod was turned in October of that year to commemorate Acton's centennial and Halton's new regional government. Original estimates of

\$350,000 for the new building escalated to \$550,000 by 1974 and the building's completion.  
On Friday September 13, 1974 the key was turned on the old Legion door. Dedication of the new Legion took place the following day. Already a new addition has been completed this year. The mortgage was paid off by March 21, 1980.  
A recent event attracting many spectators occurred November 9, 1975 with the settling of a Silver Star CT33, MK3 jet aircraft on the Legion lawn as a permanent museum piece.  
The 68 page history is available to the general public at a cost of \$5. It's published by the Legion and dedicated to the departed comrades.
