Ontario's Tax Grants for Senior Citizens. 1981 installments have been mailed.

Last year Ontario replaced its system of tax credits for seniors with a new program of Property and Sales Tax Grants. The Property Tax Grant of up to \$500 is provided in two installments annually. The Sales Tax Grant is an automatic \$50 paid each year to Ontario residents 65 and over.

Property Tax Grants

- Eligibility. If you're 65 or over and own or rent your home you're eligible for the Property Tax Grant of up to \$500.
- If you reside in a nursing home, a home for the aged or similar institution, you're not eligible for the Property Tax Grant unless you pay for the full cost of your care and the institution pays municipal and school taxes.
- No Application Needed. If you qualified for the Property Tax Grant last year you'll automatically receive the April installment. This cheque, to a maximum of \$250 will be half of last year's grant. Your installment cheque was mailed April 6th. This is intended to assist you in paying your property tax or rent for the first part of 1981.

- In all other areas, dial 1-800-268-7121.

Sales Tax Grants

An annual \$50 Grant is paid automatically to every senior citizen. You will receive your 1981 Sales Tax Grant this fall.
