The public is invited to come out to Blue Springs Scout Reserve this weekend and enjoy their hot air balloon rides in support of the Boy Scouts of Canada.

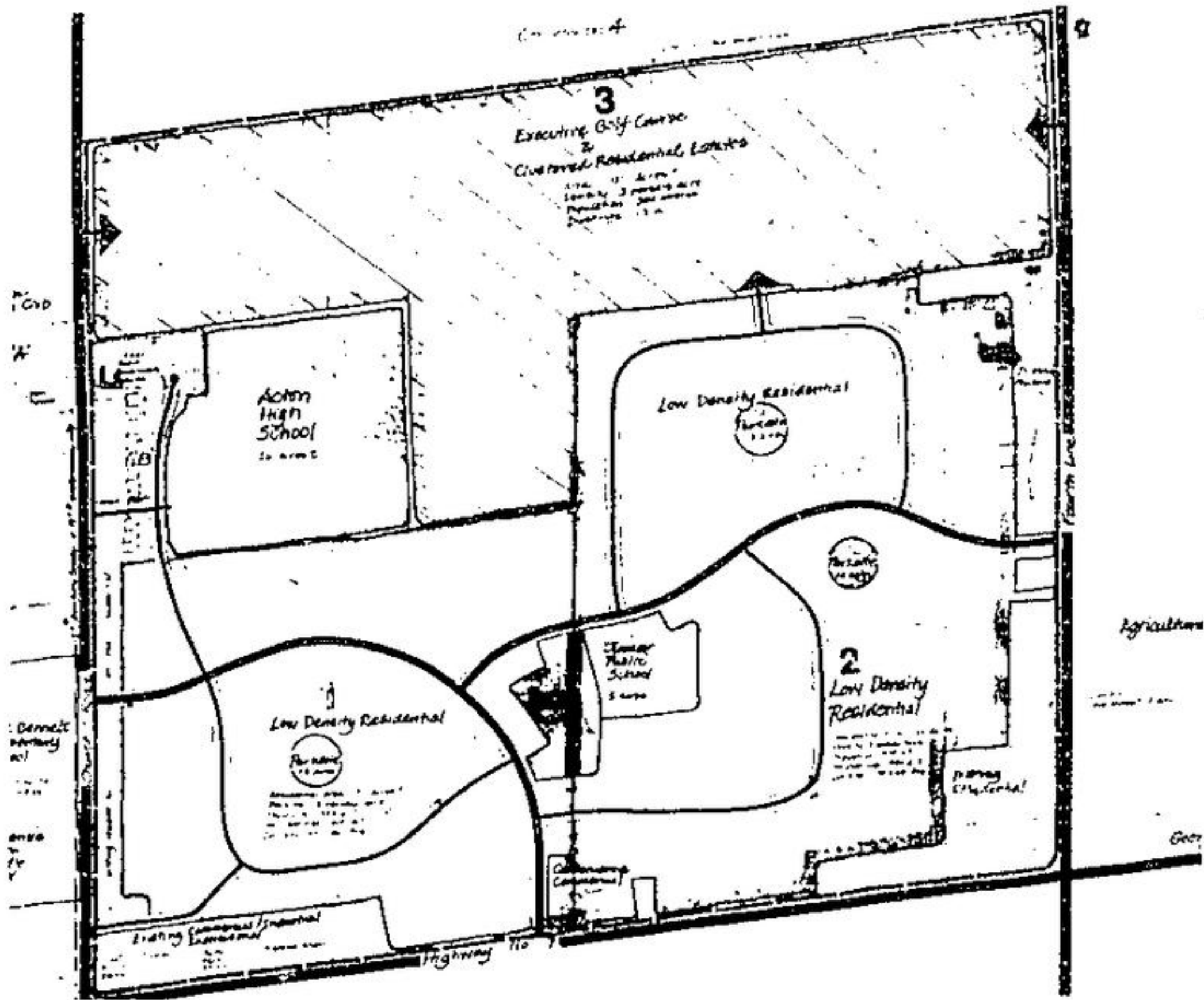
As well scouts will be selling refreshments. All proceeds from rides and admission go to support scout activities.

Municipality receives plan

Mike Armstrong, chairman of Halton Hills planning board and the joint region-town steering committee looking at urban servicing boundaries for Acton, received a copy of the Acton Heights Development Plan Friday.

Contents of the plan, which calls for a major residential development of over 1,000 homes and an executive golf course on the east side of town between Churchill Rd. North and the Fourth Line were reported in this newspaper last week.

Armstrong said plan-ner Mario Venditti also received a copy of the Acton Heights Development Plan last week.

He said there is a "possibility" the development will never be built if there isn't enough sewage capacity.

The sewage capacity question won't be answered until a consultant's report is completed and the committee has a chance to review it.

He said he isn't opposed to the development proposal and it will be examined like other proposals if there is sewage capacity.

Armstrong said he had the chance to study and had the chance to review it.

Former Acton OPP Cpl. 'promoted'

Acton's last OPP detachment commander has been appointed acting deputy chief at Tilsonburg while some members of that force face criminal charges.

OPP Corporal Bob Arbour has been working at the Tilsonburg town police office since last week. Ontario Provincial Police charged four members of the Tilsonburg force—including the chief and deputy chief—with a number of criminal offences.

Cpl. Arbour was in charge of the Acton OPP station until the fall of 1975 when Halton Regional Police took over law enforcement.

Early in his career Cpl. Arbour was stationed at Tilsonburg for about seven years. Then he spent five-and-a-half years at Port Burwell, south of Tilsonburg. Recently he has worked out of Burlington after a stint in Milton.

In a telephone interview Arbour indicated he believed he was selected because of his experience in administration and in small towns. Tilsonburg is about twice Acton's size.

OPP staff superintendent James A. Jolley was sworn in as acting chief. He and Arbour will probably remain in charge until charges against the Tilsonburg officers are disposed of.

Provincial police laid the charges—including unlawful confinement, assault causing bodily harm, perjury and unlawfully pointing a firearm—after a six month investigation.

Finance appointment

Halton Board of Education appointed Ron Warren as its new area superintendent of finance effective in May.

The appointment came during the board's Thursday meeting at Burlington. Warren has been given until May 1983 to complete qualifications for the supervisory officer's certificate.

Warren is taking the place of Barbara Moore who was promoted earlier this year to the rank of superintendent of finance.
