

Cornwell seeks dirt track title

Two of Canada's expert dirt-track riders have hit the American National Championship trail, in California this month. Canada's National Champion, Peter Grant of Woodbridge, and Jon Cornwell, rookie AMA expert from Georgetown, Ontario have joined forces to carry the Canadian flag to the Winston Pro Series.

Last minute mechanical problems prevent both riders from making the first of the California races, the Ascot TT, but they arrived in time for the Sacramento Mile. Mechanical gremlins however, continued to dog them. Grant managed to qualify as first alternate for the semifinal but when the call came—his bike failed to start, owing no doubt, to two bent valves.

Cornwell, exultant at the prospect of riding a mile track on a competitive machine was disappointed when a gamble with a marginal clutch went sour as the clutch slipped and finally burned out.

Reporting by phone from California, Cornwell had evidently bounced back from the disappointment. "Riding the mile is fantastic, I

love it—there's nothing else like it. We've just put a new clutch in the bike and Peter has fixed the valves so we're ready to go again. Peter is going to ride the regular Ascot weekend races so we're heading down to L.A. and I'll get a chance to check out the track. We'll be riding 'The Mile' at San Jose on May 3rd and the Ascot half mile May 9th."

Grant's XR750 has been supplied by Fred Deeley Imports, the Canadian Harley Davidson distributor and Cornwell after some interesting performances at Daytona has been picked up again by the

dominate the lightweight class in 1980.

Cornwell, who is also sponsored by Microton, Aral helmets and Tsubaki chain will once again be riding the venerable 500 cc Yamaha, tuned by Brian Olsen, at short tracks and TT's.

Asked what his goals for the season are, Cornwell promptly rattled off, "Canadian National Champion, AMA Rookie of the Year,

and to learn as much as I can." Cornwell considers himself to be in an interesting position. Granted the unexpected opportunity to compete at the highest level of dirt track racing he is also aware that as a rookie expert he has even less experience than most of the U.S. riders since he has spent only one previous year competing on the AMA circuit.

Cornwell knows he's bitten off a large chunk

"With EGF sponsoring me I've probably got the most competitive Harley in Canada to ride and with Doug Sehl tuning it, the most meticulous preparation—I just hope I can justify their choice of me as their rider. It's not going to be easy, I've got a lot of catching up to do!"

The EGF Racing Team, masterminded by enthusiast Erhart Frohlich of Cummings Truck and Trailers, brings together some of Canada's best dirt-track talent. Semi-retired Canadian and AMA expert Paul Eggleton, is acting as team manager and former Canadian National Champion and AMA national rider Doug Sehl is tuning. The group's aim is to see Canadian riders earning AMA national points. Cornwell's conclusion is "We'll never get any better unless we go where the competition is."

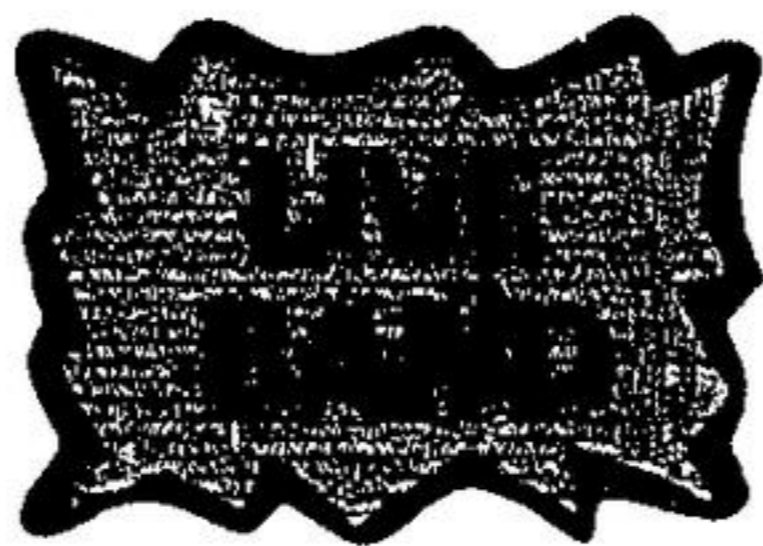

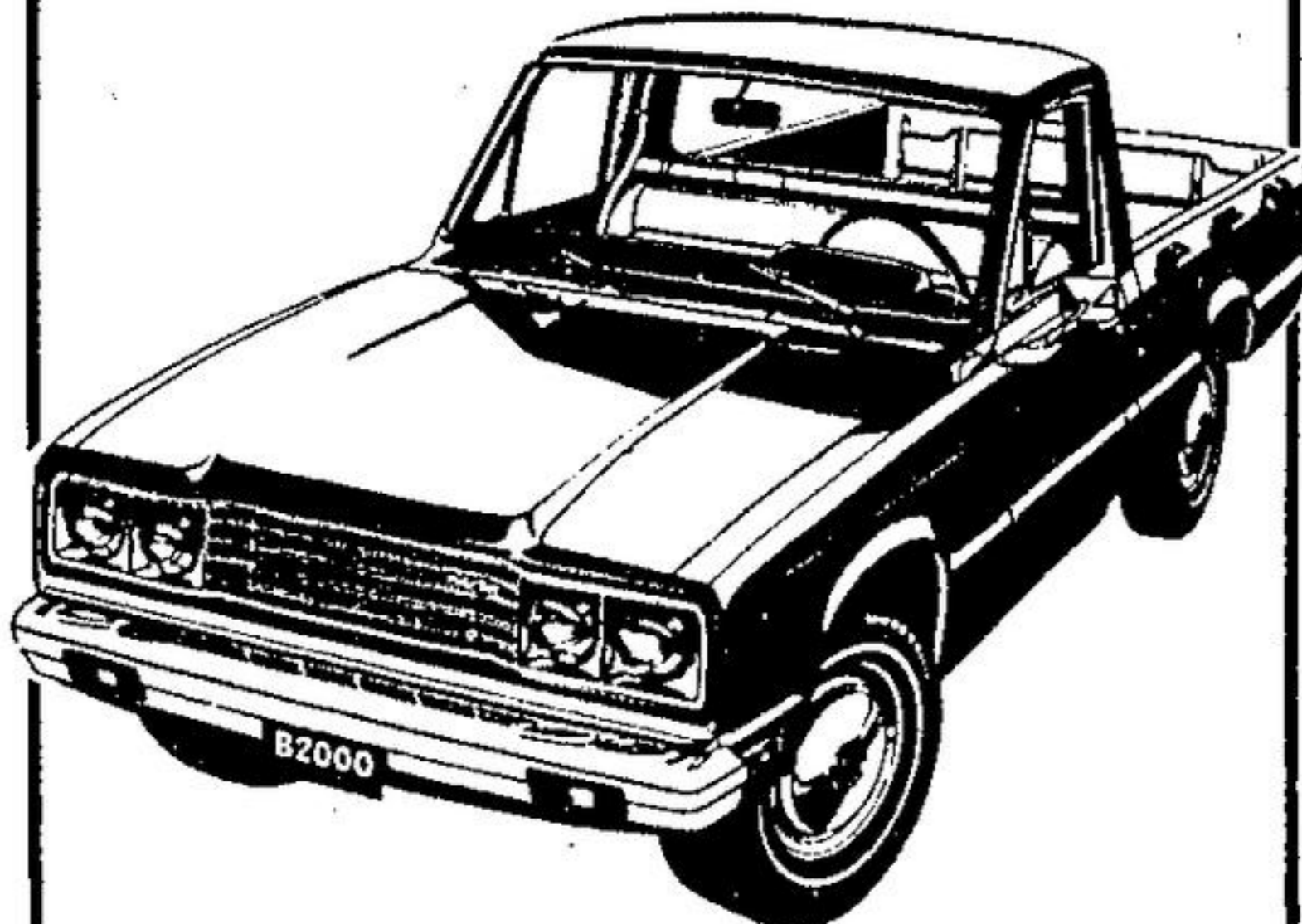
