

# Question on facemasks disrupts OHA meeting

Whether or not to wear facemasks, that is the question.

The mandatory use of the protective shield almost caused the annual general meeting of the Ontario Hockey Association to go out of control Saturday at Toronto.

Many teams are known to be against its mandator-

use and when the issue was raised in an afternoon session several motions and amendments were raised and bedlam almost broke out.

However, when calmer minds won out in the end, it was determined that each team in the OHA would send its own view of the rule to the OHA

within the next two weeks.

The OHA will then tabulate the votes. A majority vote for each division within the OHA will determine whether facemasks are mandatory or optional.

In effect, what the OHA did was turn back the decision to the teams.

Presently, facemasks

are mandatory for all junior players below Major A level. Several junior teams were known to be against the motion when it was introduced last year and would have preferred it to be introduced gradually across the province.

Currently, all players registered in the Ontario Minor Hockey Association are required to wear the protective shields.

After much confusion on the floor, Rockton

He suggested the decision be left to the discretion of each OHA group and that is what the members eventually decided to do, voting on the matter by a 84-44 margin.

Several teams said they would ask their leagues to withdraw from the OHA should the masks be mandatory. That is what stopped the Ontario Hockey League (Major A) from accepting the rule last year.

In other OHA news, it was determined all OHA
