Meals on Wheels prices may go up

Meals on Wheels will likely go up 25 to 50 cents a day now that Reliable Taxi won't be bringing the meals to town for free.

Peggie Balkind, co-ordinator of the Acton Community Services Centre which runs Meals on Wheels here, explained Reliable Taxi has generously been bringing back the hot noon meals from Halton Manor after taking youngsters to Tinkerbell Nursery in Milton.

However, Reliable Taxi no longer has the contract to deliver children to Milton so they can't bring the meals to town.

But, the meals aren't going to stop. Starting this week, three days a week, Acton Meals on Wheels drivers will go to Milton and pick up the meals. The other two days Spayside drivers will travel to Milton and bring them back to Spayside and be met by Acton drivers. The Spayside drivers pick up a meal for a resident of that village two days a week.

Mrs. Balkind observed this new arrangement appears to present no problems in keeping the program running, except it will increase costs because mileage is paid. "It's a problem but we are working around it."

However, she expects the mileage cost will result in the price of the \$1.50 a day meals being increased 25 or 50 cents. She doesn't know when that increase will come into effect, the centre will wait to see how much its costs go up because of the new pick-up system.

The centre will continue to look for a firm or individual that makes daily trips to Milton around the noon hour.
