## Citizens' Band grant

The Ministry of Culture and Recreation has agreed to assist the Acton Citizens' Band with the purchase of new jackets. Most of the jackets are 35-years-old.

A cheque in the amount of \$2,014 has just been received and the band must now raise an equal amount. Some money

had already been raised and set aside for special instruments, but this will be diverted to the uniform project which is now urgent. As band members are so involved with practises and playing, they do not have much time for fund raising so to raise \$2,000 is quite an undertaking. They depend upon a

grant from the town for annual running expenses and in return play in parades and concerts in Halton Hills without charge. The Band Hall was built by the members with the physical and financial support of local people and continues to be self-supporting through rentals for dances and meetings.

It should be mentioned that group lessons are given to adults and children who wish to learn to play an instrument. Anyone interested in playing in the Band should contact Bandmaster George Elliott at 853-0365.

## May open gravel pit on Boss land

Gravel on land owned by Casey Boss, RR 4, Acton, might be mined this year to supply material for construction of Highways 401 and 403.

Monday Halton Hills council approved the listing on provincial government tenders of the Boss property.

Council deferred a decision on the province's request to also list pits on the Cohoon property across the road and Goldan Holdings, just south-east of Acton. Councillor Russ Miller said Boss wasn't aware the province wants gravel from his land and doesn't know if he'll go along with the plan.

Miller suggested trucks leaving the Boss property should go out 22 Sideroad to Highway 25. He was backed by all councillors except Pam Sheldon. Miller supported this route because it wouldn't bother many residents and the roads would best be able to handle heavy traffic. He thought the province might pay for some improvements on 22 Sideroad.

Sheldon favored a Fourth Line to 17 Sideroad to Trafalgar Rd.

route. She said there is already too much truck traffic on Highway 25 and it is going to be fixed anyway so if the trucks went on 17 Sideroad maybe the province would contribute heavily to fix that road too.

Miller said over 1 million tons of gravel would come out of Halton Hills if the contractors for the two projects selected the local pits.
