


Laurie Ogden, grade four, experiments with detergent to find out which really does clean best, in her science fair project.

Left Kelly Koeliner and Jessie Kee conduct their own consumer research as they discover which paper towel absorbs the most.




Peter Armstrong follows the birth and growth of a calf in five days for his science fair project.




A minature Mount St. Helens, built by grade five student Cathy Britton erupts during the science fair. Baking soda is the trick.



Another Hydro official, Arvo Wiltenberg, said Hydro is looking at a number of alternative routes to bring more power out of the Bruce Nuclear generating station but none include a route anywhere in Halton

Macauley and others allowed the province is being pressured by municipal power utilities to have a second corridor built out of the Bruce. The new route would have to be approved in environmental assessment hearings and the Ontario government will decide when the new corridor is built.
