

Bump-for-Life raises \$2,264 but fewer students dance

The sixth annual Bump-for-Life marathon dance ground out more than \$2,000 at Acton High School Saturday.

Some 95 students danced to the tunes spun by CKFM radio's D.J. Don Daynard for ten hours in the school's auditorium.

Bump-for-Life is a Georgetown Kinsmen Club project which is held to raise money for research on the disease Cystic Fibrosis.

The AHS crew gathered \$2,264.70 worth of pledges. Kinsman Bob Malcolmson observed there were fewer dancers this year than last. However, they still produced a great many pledges for the worthy cause.

Acton Bump-for-Lifers brought in more than \$4,500 last year. No dance-a-thon was conducted in Georgetown because of the low numbers last year.

In addition to the special guest Don Daynard, the Kinsmen had their prancing Beaver on hand to inspire lagging

dancers.

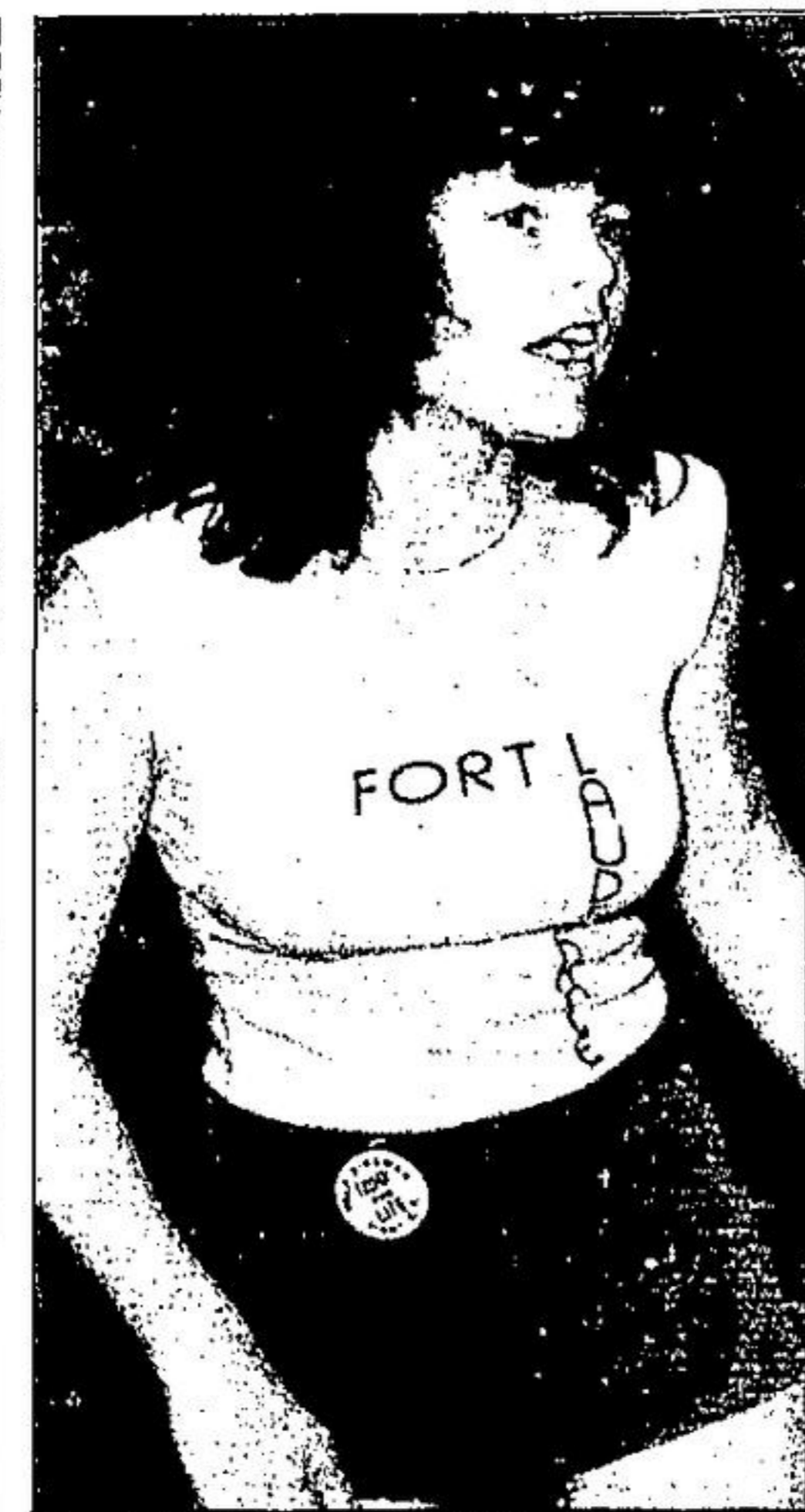
