The first step in making the team championship calibre was to put them in a league that would be more equal to their ability and the local side joined the Inter-county Fastball League where they meet the best from Guelph, Kitchener, Woodstock, and Galt.

To date in league action the in-n-outers have picked up one win and three losses including a 13-3 drubbing by Woodstock on Monday night.
