## Proposed Hydro corridor is twin of ICG's idea

An old Interested Citizens' Group (ICG) suggestion for getting electricity out of the Bruce nuclear generator is re-appearing as a new Ontario Hydro proposal. Six possible routes for joining the Bruce to the provincial grid were unveiled last week at London. One of the possible routes—and the cheapest—runs to Essa near Barrie. There it would join an existing line to Toronto and northern Ontario. Halton Hills and Milton residents will recall that the first 500 kV line, which was for years the subject of bitter ICG and Ontario Hydro battles, was completed last summer. That first 500 kV line runs from north to south

## Seek quarry fight help

Halton Hills Council has asked the Halton Region Conservation Authority to help the town fight plans for a quarry near Speyside. Halton Hills is asking HRC to help finance a hydrogeological study of the lands off Highway 25 which Standard Aggregates owns and want to turn into an extraction pit. The town will use the study when it appears before the Niagara Escarpment Commission

some time this month. The town is also hoping HRC will give supporting evidence to the NEC. Halton Hills has hired the consulting firm of M. M. Dillon to do the study at a cost of \$8,000 and this includes giving evidence. Presently the town thinks the situation should be of concern to the authority and Halton Region and the Town of Milton.

The authority has been told there is support money in the budget for legal expenses. The HRC, at its regular meeting, decided to have staff meet with Halton Hills, Milton, and Halton Region on the question of the Standard Aggregates application and report back.

## Obituary Jack Greer

Well-known local hockey player and performer in minstrel shows, John Matthew ("Jack") Greer is dead at the age of 71. He died May 27 1981 at St. Joseph's Hospital after a lengthy illness.

A star goalkeeper and defenseman for the Acton Tanners in the 30's, Mr. Greer was also known for his popular appearances in the town hall variety minstrel shows. A foreman in the Rolling Room at Beardmore, Mr. Greer served several years on Acton council, was active in the Y's Men's Club, Acton Bridge Club, and played Santa Claus for the Beardmore Christmas parties. He was generally very involved with community activities.

He was born June 23, 1909 in Bracebridge, the son of William James Greer and Mary Thompson. He attended both public and high schools in Bracebridge. In 1929 he was brought to Acton to play hockey. He married Theima Doris Gamble on January 3, 1931 in Acton.

The couple had four children and nine grandchildren. Although Mr. Greer resided in the Crescent for many years his last address was 17 Elizabeth Drive.

Left to mourn are daughter Joyce (Mrs. Gordon Akitt) of Burlington sons James of West Hill and William; sisters Mrs. Anne Moore of Walkerton and Mrs. Mabel Barlow of Mississauga and nine grandchildren. Mr. Greer was predeceased by his wife, daughter June and brothers Frederick and William.

He was affiliated with Knox Presbyterian Church. Funeral service was held May 30 at Shoemaker Funeral Home with Rev. James Peter Jones from Knox Presbyterian Church in Guelph officiating. Pallbearers were Acton friends Harry Arbie, Bill Coates, Ed Footitt, Pat MacKenzie, Lloyd Masales and Lorne Walters.
