Student establishing in Acton Friendly Visitors program

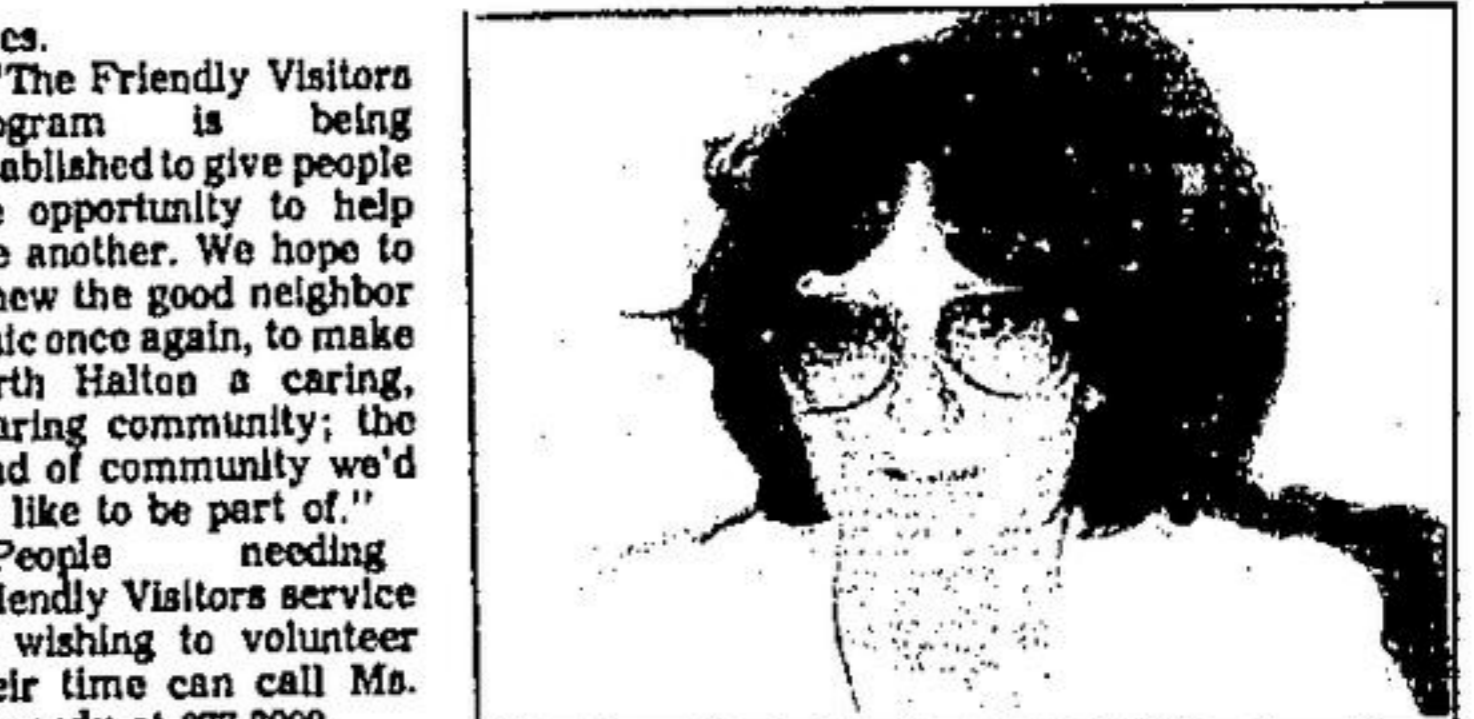
The frail, elderly and handicapped people of Acton, Georgetown and Milton can expect to be visited this summer by a student working for Halton Helping Hands. Jane Kennedy, a graduate of the University of Windsor with a degree in psychology and social welfare, has been hired under a summer student grant program to set up a volunteer Friendly Visitors program in the three communities in north Halton.

The program will be geared to meeting the "unmet needs" of the frail, elderly and disabled. Ms. Kennedy said, "There are some things that we cannot do for ourselves, by ourselves. Sometimes we require a helping hand. It doesn't take much time and the experience can be ever so rewarding."

The program will run through to the end of August hopefully then be run in the fall by the North Halton Volunteer Centre.
